GAMBLING ACT 2005 – DELEGATION OF LICENSING AUTHORITY FUNCTIONS

1.0 Matter for consideration

1.1 The Committee to consider the delegation of the Licensing Authority's functions under the Gambling Act 2005.

2.0 Recommendation(s)

- 2.1 That the Licensing Panels comprising of 3 Members, constituted under the Licensing Act 2003 be authorised to undertake hearings in accordance with Article 8.02 of the Council's Constitution, the Gambling Act 2005 and consequent regulations.
- 2.2 That the Head of Legal and Democratic Services determine the makeup of the Panels (not to be politically balanced) with Members as far as practically possible serving in rotation.
- 2.3 That each Panel select a Chairman at the beginning of each meeting.
- 2.4 That the Head of Legal and Democratic Services identify a standby Member for each Panel meeting to cover for illness, Members who have interests etc.
- 2.5 That in line with the operation of the Panels under the Licensing Act 2003, an equal maximum amount of time be set by each Panel at the beginning of each different hearing, for a party to address the Panel, give any further information or call any witnesses for the hearing.
- 2.6 That the Gambling Act 2005 functions be delegated to Licensing Panels and the Head of Legal and Democratic Services as set out in Appendix 5a
- 2.7 That the Head of Legal and Democratic Services be authorised to amend the Constitution as appropriate.

3.0 Information

- 3.1 The Gambling Act 2005 received Royal Assent on 7 April 2005 and comes into force on the 1st September 2007.
- 3.2 The Act sets up a new regulatory body called the Gambling Commission that will also be responsible for the issuing of Personal and Operator Licences.
- 3.3 The Act also provides the following additional responsibilities for Licensing Authorities:
 - Premises Licenses for gambling activities: casinos, betting shops, bingo halls, adult

entertainment centres, family entertainment centres and tracks.

- Regulating gaming and gaming machines in alcohol-licensed premises.
- Granting permits for gaming and gaming machines in clubs.
- Granting permits to family entertainment centres for the use of certain lower stake gaming machines.
- Granting permits for prize gaming.
- Considering notices given for the temporary use of premises for gaming.
- Considering occasional use notices for betting at tracks.
- Registering small societies' lotteries
- 3.4 Section 154 of the Gambling Act 2005 automatically delegates the Licensing Authority's functions to the Licensing Committee established under section 6 of the Licensing Act 2003.
- 3.5 As with the Licensing Act 2003, Licensing Panels should consist of three Councillors who sit to hear applications where representations have been received. The Panels have to be drawn from the fifteen Councillors on the Licensing Committee.
- 3.6 A set of functions identified in the report to Council is set out at Appendix 5a. This Committee is now required to formally delegate powers to officers and Licensing Panels to consider and determine applications.
