### **Mandatory Licensing Conditions**

Attaching to premises licences/club premises certificates that authorise the sale by retail or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises:

# In force 06/04/10

1. The responsible person shall take all reasonable steps to ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.

An irresponsible promotion means anyone or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises in a manner which carries a significant risk of leading or contributing to crime and disorder, prejudice to public safety, public nuisance, or harm to children –

- a. Games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage individuals to
  - i. Drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or
  - ii. Drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);
- Provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic (other than any promotion or discount available to an individual in respect of alcohol for consumption at a table meal, as defined by section 159 of the Act);
- Provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less;
- d. Provision of free or discounted alcohol in relation to the viewing on the premises of a sporting event, where that provision is dependant on –
  - i. The outcome of a race, competition or other event or process, or
  - ii. The likelihood of anything occurring or not occurring;
- 2. The responsible person shall ensure that no alcohol is dispensed directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of a disability).
- 3. The responsible person shall ensure that free tap water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.

## In force 01/10/10

- 4. The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder shall ensure that an age verification policy applies to the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol. The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 year of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and a holographic mark.
- 5. The responsible person shall ensure that
  - a. Where any of the following alcoholic drink is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures –
    - i. Beer or cider: ½ pint;
    - ii. Gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25ml or 35ml; and
    - iii. Still wine in a glass: 125ml; and
  - b. Customers are made aware of the availability of these measures.

Attaching to premises licences that authorise the sale by retail of alcohol for consumption off the premises only:

#### In force 01/10/10

The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder shall ensure that an age verification policy applies to the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol. The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 year of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and a holographic mark.

### **Definitions**

<u>Anti – Social Behaviour</u> - Behaviour by a person which causes or is likely to cause harassment, alarm or distress to one or more other persons not of the same household as the person, (S 36 Anti-Social Behaviour Act 2003)

<u>Disability</u> - a person has a disability for the purposes of this Act if he has a physical or mental impairment which has a substantial and long-term adverse effect on his ability to carry out normal day-to-day activities. (Section 1 Disability Discrimination Act 1995)

## Relevant Premises - Relevant premises" means—

- (a) Licensed premises, or
- (b) Premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, or
- (c) Premises which may be used for a permitted temporary activity by virtue of Part 5;

(Section 159 Licensing Act 2003)

#### Responsible Person –

- (a) In relation to licensed premises—
- (i) The holder of a premises licence in respect of the premises,
- (ii) The designated premises supervisor (if any) under such a licence, or
- (iii) Any individual aged 18 or over who is authorised for the purposes of this section by such a holder or supervisor,
- (b) In relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables him to prevent the supply in question, and
- (c) In relation to premises which may be used for a permitted temporary activity by virtue of Part 5—
- (i) The premises user, or
- (ii) Any individual aged 18 or over who is authorised for the purposes of this section by the premises user.
