# APPLICATION FOR THE TRANSFER OF A PREMISES LICENCE – STONEHOUSE HOTEL

#### 1.0 Purpose of the report:

1.1 To consider an application to transfer the Premises Licence for the Stonehouse Hotel, 26/28 Vance Road.

### 2.0 Recommendation(s):

2.1 The Panel is requested to consider the representation and determine whether it is appropriate for the promotion of the crime and disorder objective to allow the transfer to take place.

#### 3.0 Reasons for recommendation(s):

- 3.1 An objection has been received therefore there must be a hearing to consider whether to issue a counter notice.
- 3.2a Is the recommendation contrary to a plan or strategy adopted or approved by the Council?
- 3.2b Is the recommendation in accordance with the Council's approved Yes budget?
- 3.3 Other alternative options to be considered:

None, once an application has been submitted and a representation received it must be considered by the Licensing Panel.

## 4.0 **Background Information**

- 4.1 On 24<sup>th</sup> March 2015, the Licensing Service received an application to transfer the premises licence for the Stonehouse Hotel 26/28 Vance Road into the name of Derek Littlejohns. A copy of the application is attached.
- 4.2 The Police have objected to the transfer on the ground of preventing crime and disorder. A copy of the representation is attached.

#### 4.3 Local policy considerations

None.

#### 4.4 National policy considerations

In exceptional circumstances where the chief of police believes the transfer may undermine the crime prevention objective, the police may object to the transfer. Such objections are expected to be rare and arise because the police have evidence that the business or individuals seeking to hold the licence or business or individuals linked to such persons are involved in crime (or disorder).

#### 4.5 **Observations**

The Stonehouse Hotel was originally licensed by the Council in 2005. The licence authorises the sale of alcohol for hotel residents and guests 24 hours a day. As this is a converted licence it only has the mandatory conditions endorsed upon it. The Panel has no powers to add conditions onto the licence today.

The premises licence was surrendered on 4<sup>th</sup> March 2015. The transfer received on 24<sup>th</sup> March 2015 had the effect of reinstating this licence. If the transfer application was refused at today's hearing, the licence would again lapse with immediate effect.

The Panel is restricted to considering only the impact on the crime and disorder objective when reaching their decision.

# Re: Application to Transfer a Premises Licence, at 26-28 Vance Road, to Mr Derek Littlejohns (previous Falconer)

I am in receipt of an application to transfer the above premises licence to the applicant, Mr Derek Littlejohns. On behalf of the Chief Officer of Police, I make a formal objection to this application.

Since 1999 Mr Littlejohns has been convicted of 4 offences in England and Scotland the last being in 2012, 3 of these convictions relate to Theft offences and the fourth being for criminal damage. The Theft offences are relevant to the Licensing Act.

Since 2000 Mr Littlejohns has also received 4 Police Cautions, 2 again for Theft offences and the remaining 2 both in 2009 for a Drugs offence that being Possession of a Class B substance and a Public Order offence contrary to Section 5 of the Public Order Act.

Although not all of the above are listed as Relevant Offences under the Licensing Act, and they may be spent under the Rehabilitation of Offenders Act, they cause huge concern to the Constabulary, due to the nature and the number of crimes.

In addition to the above the Lancashire Constabulary Intelligence system holds information which links Mr Littlejohns to matters pertaining to the Supply and Use of Drugs, Child Protection issues and also the Misuse of Alcohol and its provision to underage persons.

With the aforementioned criminal history and intelligence reports, it is our belief that Mr Littlejohns is not a fit and proper candidate to run any licensed premises in the town of Blackpool. Premises Licence Holders wishing to operate in Blackpool should be capable of, and willing to, promote the Licensing Objectives; with the objectives "The prevention

of crime and disorder" and "The protection of children from harm" in mind, it is our opinion that the applicant is neither.

If this application is granted, it is our belief it would seriously undermine the crime and disorder objective and also gravely weaken the status of Premises Licence Holders both within the licensed trade and to members of the public, police and media.
