# **APPLICATION FOR A PREMISES LICENCE – Premier Store**

# 1.0 Purpose of the report:

1.1 To consider an application for a Premises Licence in respect of Premier Store, 168 Ashfield Road for the sale of alcohol for consumption off the premises.

#### 2.0 Recommendation(s):

2.1 The Panel is requested to consider the application and determine whether the granting of this licence would adversely impact on the licensing objectives.

# 4.0 **Background Information**

- 4.1 On 21<sup>st</sup> April 2015, the Licensing Service received an application from Michelle Nelson to issue a Premises Licence at Premier Store, 168 Ashfield Road Blackpool.
- 4.2 The application requests permission to sell alcohol for consumption off the premises 09.00 21.00 hours daily. A copy of the application is attached.

# 4.4 Local policy considerations

# 4.5 National policy considerations

9.42 – The authority's decision should be evidence-based, justified as being appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives and proportionate to what it is intended to achieve.

9.43 – Determination of whether an action or step is appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives requires an assessment of what action or step would be suitable to achieve that end. Whilst this does not therefore require a licensing authority to decide that no lesser step will achieve the aim, the authority should aim to consider the potential burden that the condition would impose on the premises licence holder as well as the potential benefit in terms of promotion of the licensing objectives. However, it is imperative that the authority ensures that the factors which form the basis of its determination are limited to consideration of the promotion of the licensing objectives and nothing outside those parameters.

#### **Observations**

The police have agreed conditions with the applicant which will be added to the licence if it is granted:

- 1. An incident book will be maintained, in which shall be recorded :
  - (i) All incidents of crime and disorder
  - (ii) Refused sales to suspected under age/drunken persons
  - (iii) A record of any person refused admission or asked to leave the premises
  - (iv) Details of occasions upon which the Police are called to the premises
  - (v) The use or discovery of drugs

- That book shall be available for inspection by a Police Officer or authorised person
- 2. CCTV will be installed internally and externally at the premises and will comply with the following:
  - The CCTV system shall be installed, maintained and operated to the reasonable satisfaction of Lancashire Constabulary. All public areas of the premises are to be covered by the system. The system will incorporate a camera covering the entrance door and will be capable of providing an image which is regarded as identification standard.
  - The system will display the correct date and time
  - The system will make recordings during all hours the premises are open to the public
  - VCR tapes or digital recordings shall be held for a minimum of 31 days and 28 days respectively after the recording is made and will be made available to the Police or any authorised persons for inspection upon request.
  - The system will, as a minimum, record images of the head and shoulders of all persons entering the premises.
  - A staff member who is conversant with the operation of the CCTV system will be on the premises at all times the premises are open to the public. This staff member will be able to show recent data or footage with the absolute minimum of delay when requested to by a Police Officer or a Local Authority Enforcement Officer.
  - The Licence Holder or Designated Premises Supervisor shall notify the Police Licensing Unit on any occasion when the CCTV is to be inoperative for a period in excess of one working day and shall provide a certificate from a competent person stating the reason for the system being inoperative and the measures which have been taken to satisfy the licence conditions
  - Appropriate signage alerting customers to CCTV recording shall be displayed in conspicuous positions on the premises.
- 3. An authorisation of sales, signed and dated by the DPS, shall be kept at the premises showing all persons authorised by them to make sales of alcohol at the premises. All staff involved in the sale of alcohol will be at least 18 years of age and will receive training to promote the licensing objectives. All training to be documented and records made available on request to a Police Officer or any authorised officer.
- 4. A personal licence holder shall be available at all times while the sale and supply of alcohol takes place. A personal licence holder does not need to be present at the premises at all times but must be readily available to

contact.

- 5. The licence holder is to support and rigorously enforce the Challenge 25 proof of age policy.
- 6. Any person who looks or appears to be under the age of 25 shall be asked to provide identification that they are over the age of 18. The following are the only forms of identification acceptable:
  - i. UK photo driving licence
  - ii. Passport
  - iii. Proof of Age Standards Scheme card.
- 7. Signs promoting this policy will be prominently displayed at public entrances and alcohol sales areas
- 8. All staff to have received suitable training in relation to the Proof of Age Scheme to be applied upon the premises. Records to evidence this will be made available to an authorised officer upon request. Staff will be trained on appointment and every 6 months thereafter.



We are instructed by Mr Neve the owner of the above property. He has passed to us your letter of 12<sup>th</sup> March 2015 addressed to Mr Vipudshan the current occupier of the property.

The purpose of this letter is to advise you that Mr Neve does not accept that your client has any valid grounds to object as you say and to explain the reasoning behind his rejection in accordance with the Civil Procedure Rules Practice Direction on Pre-Action Conduct.

You will appreciate that there is no specific protocol in place in relation to disputes such as these but the purpose of this letter is to clarify our client's position and to give you the opportunity to respond.

We would be obliged if you could respond within 14 days of the date of this letter.

We shall deal with the matters in the order in which you deal with them in your letter for ease of reference.

- 1. The covenant in the conveyance of 31 March 1964 ("the Fieldings Covenant")
  - 1.1. For the reasons set out here we do not believe the covenant is binding in any event and the comments we make below are made without prejudice to that contention.
  - 1.2. You do not state that your client has the benefit of the covenant or give any explanation as to how it might have become entitled to the rights of R Fielding and Son (Builders) Ltd.
  - 1.3. We are not aware that your client has obtained such rights. In any event that company was acquired by Costain in or about 1969 and no longer appears on any documents at Companies House. It has presumably been dissolved. Your dient would have to demonstrate a separate acquisition of those rights.
  - 1.4. Unless it can do so, under the rules as to privity of contract your client cannot enforce the covenant so whether or not your objections previously were successful we consider that your Directors client has no right so to do.

- "This covenant [i.e. the Fielding's Covenant] does not permit the sale of intoxicants." That is incorrect.
  - 2.1. The covenant actually says that the property will be used "...... for the business of Grocers and Provision Merchants"
  - 2.2. The rule of construction of contra proferentem would apply here and a restrictive construction of the provision would undoubtedly be applied.
  - 2.3. If the person framing the covenant had wanted to exclude the sale of alcohol it could easily have been inserted. It has not been so inserted and would not be implied.
  - 2.4. You appear to have overlooked that Sainsbury's, Tesco, Asda, Waitrose, Morrisons, Aldi and Lidl all describe themselves as "grocers" yet they sell enormous amounts of alcohol. Indeed we understand that Tesco sells more wine than any other retailer in the UK.
  - 2.5. To suggest therefore that the description of a business as "grocers" precludes sale of alcohol is simply unrealistic.
- 3. "The covenants in 1964 were imposed for the mutual benefit of the covenantors"
  - 3.1. This might be the case in relation to the conveyance to your client where there is a non-competition scheme.
  - 3.2. That does not apply in the Fieldings Covenant. There is simply nothing to support your assertion of mutual benefit and indeed the absence of those provisions make it all the more probable that there is no reason for there to be any restriction on the use of our client's property.
- You appear to have overlooked the provisions of the Competition Act which came into force on 6<sup>th</sup>
  April 2011 and has retrospective effect.
  - 4.1. This Act outlaws restrictions or restrictive covenants limiting the type of commercial activity which a tenant or occupier may undertake particularly where it is intended to protect the landlord or other tenants from competition.
  - 4.2. Accordingly, even if we are completely mistaken in our analysis of the position as set out above (which we do not accept) the provisions of the Competition Act apply.
  - 4.3. Any form of arrangement particularly that set out in your clients conveyance are rendered null and void by the Competition Act and the proposition you put forward is equally and thoroughly defeated in the same fashion.

In summary therefore we cannot see that your client has any standing to object to the grant of a licence to our clients or others.

Even if it does have standing then the Competition Act precludes any objection.

Any attempt to so object could well be unreasonable interference in our client's right to trade and an attempt to circumvent the Competition Act.

We require that your client either:-

1. confirms that it will not pursue any objection either to the local authority or otherwise should an application for alcohol licence be made in relation to these premises or

2. alternatively that you respond in detail to deal with these arguments so that the issues may be clarified and narrowed.

As indicated above please could you respond within 14 days of the date of this letter or in any event no later than 4 p.m. on Friday 29<sup>th</sup> May 2015.

In the absence of response we have advised our client to issue an application pursuant to CPR 40.20 for a declaratory judgement.

This is obviously going to incur costs but our client cannot continue with the threat of proceedings from your client hanging over his head and the issue must be dealt with once and for all.

We invite you to avoid this by confirming that you accept the position as we lay it out here and that your client will not seek to object either to the local authority or through the courts.

We look forward to receiving confirmation by the time mentioned above. In the absence of a response proceedings will be issued without further notice. This correspondence will be relied upon in any application for costs.

I write in respect of the above licensing application as I feel that objections need to be raised.

This latest application states that the above named person wishes to apply for a licence for the supply of alcohol. I find this statement more alarming than the recent previous two applications — one withdrawn and the second refused as it does not give any proposed times for the sale of alcohol.

This application only states "for the supply of alcohol". Are we to assume that this is for an "off licence" premises or for a grocery store with alcohol available for sale and does this mean that the premises wishes to sell alcohol at whatever time of day or night they are open to the public.

Again we, the residents, find ourselves in a position of once again having to go through the motions having to put our objections forward.

Again I would advise Blackpool Borough Council to refuse the application – principally within the following categories:-

- 1. The Protection of Children
- 2. The Prevention of Nuisance
- 3. The Protection of Public Safety
- 4. The Prevention of Crime & Disorder

As I understand, from previously making objections and attending the last Licencing Hearing, Blackpool Council feels the area of Ashfield Road is not within a "saturation area" of licenced premises.

I would strongly argue this point stating that the whole of Blackpool is saturated with licenced premises and to allow further saturation within a densely populated area of

residential properties with a high number of children and elderly this should be one of the main reasons for refusal.

We have seen over the years how Blackpool has become a place of lewd, aggressive behaviour and is now in need of complete overall. It is dirty; offensive language can be heard by just walking up a street; people in a state of complete drunkenness; the local A/E department overstretched by people so drunk they fall over or get into fights and we the tax payers yet again having to pick up the bill for these people. Enough is enough – no more licenced premises please.

Of note over recent years we have seen an upsurge in lewd behaviour around this particular shop and other shops on the same block and this is without an additional premises selling alcohol. This is particularly alarming as we now have an undertakers within this row of shops and in my opinion more respect should be being observed.

There are ample premises selling alcohol in Bispham Village and a convenience/alcohol shop further down the road opposite the University Campus.

The Off Licence premises which already sells alcohol has a good relationship with the residents of the surrounding area by limiting the opening times and works very well.

I would again strongly urge Blackpool Council to refuse this application as this is a densely populated area with many children and elderly in close proximity and we should not be exposing vulnerable children and adults to people who do not care for their local community and are hell bent on fuelling their addictions without redress to the consequences of their unsociable habits at any time of the day or night.

## **Dear Sirs**

I wish to object to the grant of a Premises Licence for 168-170 Ashfield Road, Bispham, Blackpool.

I was previously a joint licensee for the Off Licence at 156 Ashfield Rd and know this area well and I am currently a director of the company that owns 156-158 Ashfield Road.

At one time I ran a number of Off Licences and our shop at 156 Ashfield Rd was particularly targeted by under aged customers attempting to purchase alcohol. This might have been because of the local proximity of a nearby school and college. The bus stop in front of the property may have also contributed to this and on regular occasions gangs of youths would congregate outside. These youths would often intimidate and pester regular customers, asking them to purchase alcohol on their behalf.

There are already quite sufficient shops selling alcohol in the Bispham area to satisfy any legitimate demand and the addition of a further licensed outlet, doors away from a specialist Off Licence would simply exaggerate the problems of public nuisance and the risk of children obtaining alcohol. It has always been my belief that a general store selling a range of products is more likely to attract under aged customers, than a strictly controlled pure Off Licence.

Although not of immediate concern to the Licensing Committee, this block of shops and the houses around the area were developed by Fieldings a local building company in it's day. Fieldings saw the sense of the six shops offering a range of different products to the local community and not directly competing with each other, consequently in the deeds of sale for these shops they put restrictive covenants to ensure a separation of trades. The applicant's store is restricted to selling grocery items only, which does not include alcoholic products, as this was to be the preserve of 156 Ashfield Rd. I am aware that this is not strictly a matter that will concern your deliberations but I feel it is something you should consider when looking at the broader picture, when considering this matter.

Currently, the premises in question, has a retail area surrounded by Perspex as protection against the numerous attacks that have taken place over the years. Outside CCTV has been fitted, and the police have numerous instances, where their presence has been required to alleviate unwelcome advances. One can only presume, this would only escalate if a license were granted, increasing therefore the likelihood of crime.
