APPLICATION FOR A PERSONAL LICENCE – Garry Milton Gill

1.0 Purpose of the report:

- 1.1 To consider an application by Garry Milton Gill for the grant of a Personal Licence.

4.0 **Background Information**

4.1 On 26 September 2016, the Licensing Service received an application for a Personal Licence from Garry Milton Gill. As the accompanying disclosure revealed a live relevant offence a copy of the application was sent to the Police for their consideration.

The Licensing Service received an objection from the Police on 6 October 2016.

4.2 Local policy considerations

7.2.4 of the Statement of Licensing Policy states the following – " at a hearing a panel of the licensing committee will consider whether the granting of the licence would undermine the crime prevention objective. The panel will consider the seriousness of the conviction(s), the time that has elapsed since the offence(s) were committed and any mitigating circumstances. Applications will normally be refused unless there are exceptional and compelling circumstances which justify grant.

4.3 National policy considerations

4.11 – A number of relevant offences never become spent. However, where an applicant is able to demonstrate that the offence in question took place so long ago and that the applicant no longer has a propensity to re-offend, a licensing authority my consider that it is appropriate to grant the application on the basis that doing so would not undermine the crime prevention objective.

4.4 Observations

When considering an application for a personal licence the panel is only concerned with the crime prevention objective. The panel are also restricted to considering live relevant convictions. Any offences which are spent or are not considered to be relevant must not be taken into account when considering whether the application for a personal licence should be granted.
