I am a resident of Layton and I am shocked to see another premises licence application for Folklore 13 Westcliffe Drive, Blackpool, Lancashire, FY3 7BJ, DPS and Applicant Mr Janusz Artur Kuca.

In the space of 300 yards we have a Tesco express, PG Discount store, Mc colls, Best one, CO-OP few hundred yards we have a Esso garage & Layton wines how many more do we need? Present premises 13 Westcliff drive share the same wall to another off licence 11 Westcliffe drive T/A Westcliffe food and wine Best one.

Crime and disorder, public safety

I have noticed at weekend's young groups hanging around the bus stops and off-licences in Layton throwing litter outside and creating nuisance for the public, Vandalising the bus stops, Bins thrown on to the road all caused by excess alcohol. I have also noticed so many drinking around Layton cemetery and public sex and I don't even feel safe walking my dog around layton.

Prevention of children from harm

There is 2 schools near by and I have seen many kids walk through Layton attending Layton primary and St Mary's it would encourage group to congregate and I don't think its an good example.

I would also like to remind Blackpool has high levels of alcohol related harm (health, disorder, violence) for the size of the population.

The health of people in Blackpool is generally worse than the England average and there are marked inequalities both between Blackpool and the national average and within the town itself. Life expectancy for men in Blackpool is the lowest in the country at 73.6 years and third lowest in the country for females at 79.4 years (England averages of 78.6 for men and 82.6 for women). There is considerable variation within Blackpool where life expectancy is

12.8 years lower for men and 8.1 years lower for women in the most deprived areas than the least deprived areas of the town. Although the overall trend shows life expectancy to be improving, it is not improving as fast in Blackpool as it is elsewhere and the gap between Blackpool and the national average is widening. Not only do people in Blackpool live shorter lives, but they also spend a smaller proportion of their lifespan in good health and without disability and in the most deprived areas of the town disability-free life expectancy is around 50 years. One of the main causes of shorter life expectancy in Blackpool is alcohol related diseases.

Based on these grounds I strongly object Mr Janusz Artur Kuca premises licence application for Folklore 13 Westcliffe Drive, Black pool, Lancashire, FY3 7BJ,
