FEES AND CHARGES – GOVERNANCE AND PARTNERSHIPS

1.0 Purpose of the report:

To consider and approve the fees and charges for Democratic Governance and Legal Services for the financial year 2018/2019.

2.0 Recommendation(s):

- 2.1 To retain the current fee of £20.00 for electoral certificates of residency with effect from 1 April 2018 to 31 March 2019.
- 2.2 To note the statutory fee for sale of the electoral register as set out in paragraph 5.2.
- 2.3 To agree the fees and charges for Legal Services as set out in Appendix A for the period 1 April 2018 to 31 March 2019.
- 2.4 To agree that the fees and charges for Legal Services can be reduced on the Published Officer decision of the Director of Governance and Partnerships, after consultation with the Leader of the Council.

3.0 Reasons for recommendation(s):

- 3.1 The fee will cover administrative costs for certificates of residency and the charge for sale of the register is in line with legislation.
- 3.2 The fees for Legal Services have been complied based on the costs of providing the service, market conditions and an increase for inflation costs factored in.
- 3.3a Is the recommendation contrary to a plan or strategy adopted or approved by the Council?
- 3.3b Is the recommendation in accordance with the Council's approved Yes budget?

4.0 Council Priority:

4.1 The relevant Council Priorities are: "The economy: Maximising growth and opportunity across Blackpool" and "Communities: Creating stronger communities and increasing resilience."

5.0 Background Information

- 5.1 A certificate of residency is requested from time to time when an elector requires confirmation of their entry on the electoral register. The certificate can be used to assist the elector in gaining credit. The charge for the certificate is currently £20.00 which covers the cost of producing the certificate. It is not proposed to increase the charge, as the cost of providing the service has not increased.
- By law, specified organisations (government departments and credit reference agencies) are entitled to a copy of the full or edited register, on payment of a statutory fee:
 - in data format, £20 plus £1.50 for each 1,000 entries (or remaining part of 1,000 entries) in it.
 - in printed format, £10 plus £5 for each 1,000 entries (or remaining part of 1,000 entries) in it.
- 5.3 The fees and charges for Legal Services have been reviewed and proposals are attached at Appendix A. They have been reviewed to be in line with other local authorities and the cost of providing the service. For some fees, the charging criterion has been amended to create a simplification of rates. For all charges, it has also been made explicit the maximum amount of hours for each fee along with a rate for additional hours. This change means that the charges accurately reflect the actual costs of providing services meaning that more complicated matters are not subsidised by more straightforward ones.
