

I wish to offer objection to the following application:

Application under Licensing Act 2003 - Premises license in relation to premises to be known as The Cafe Guest House, 33 Wellington Road, Blackpool FY1 6AR

Live music and recorded music Monday to Sunday 10:00 to 00:00.

Late Night Refreshment Monday to Sunday 23:00 to 05:00. Opening Hours Monday to Sunday 00:01 to 00:00.

For the sale of alcohol Monday to Sunday 00:01 to 00:00 for residents and 10:00 to 00:00 for non residents.

For the past 5 years a business has not been trading from 33 Wellington Road. It was previously a bed and breakfast business known as The Carlton Hotel which held a licence to serve alcohol to residents only. I have contacted the Planning Department who were unable to identify that an application had been received for change of use or extension to property. I have been unable to speak to Erika Henysova Nemecka to identify whether the application for late night refreshments and an application to serve alcohol to non residents is an intention to change the use of the premises from a four bedroom bed and breakfast establishment. In addition, I am unsure whether there is an intention to limit the number of visitors to the premises, which are small, and if not I have concerns in terms of health and safety.

I am the owner of a 6 bedroomed bed and breakfast establishment known as The Rimini Hotel, 31 Wellington Road, Blackpool FY1 6AR and have traded for 12 years. The area is quiet with a number of premises that have been de-registered as bed and breakfast businesses and are now private dwellings plus trading bed and breakfast businesses on the same road.

I offer the following objections:

The prevention and crime and disorder

To my knowledge none of the alcohol licenses held by businesses on Wellington Road are for non residents. I feel that providing alcohol to non-residents between 10:00 in the morning and midnight would result in disorder through drunkenness.

Public Safety

To my knowledge none of the alcohol licenses held by businesses on Wellington Road are for non residents. I feel that providing alcohol to non-residents between 10:00 in the morning and midnight would cause public safety issues through drunkenness and possible brawling.

The Prevention of Public Nuisance

To my knowledge none of the alcohol licenses held by businesses on Wellington Road are for non residents. I feel that providing alcohol to non-residents between 10:00 in the morning

and midnight would cause public nuisance issues through drunkenness and possible brawling.

The application states that late night refreshments 7 days per week from 23:00 to 5:00. It does not state whether this is for residents only. Should this to open to non residents there is likely to be ingress and egress whilst my clients are trying to rest.

The application states live music and recorded music 7 days per week 10:00 in the morning to midnight. Our premises are attached and we can hear standard movements between the buildings. Music, particularly live music, will penetrate to my establishment and may be a public nuisance, certainly later at night whilst my clients are trying to rest.

The Protection of Children from Harm

To my knowledge none of the alcohol licenses held by business on Wellington Road are for non residents. I feel that providing alcohol to non-residents between 10:00 in the morning and midnight may result in public nuisance, foul language and disorder through drunkenness. My establishment often has children staying and they are likely to suffer upset and trauma should this occur.
