PROVISION OF TARGETED SUPPORT TO PROMOTE BETTER FAMILY ENGAGEMENT IN EDUCATION AND PUPIL INCLUSION

1.0 Purpose of the report:

1.1 To seek approval to appoint School – Home Support as the provider of 'targeted support to promote better family engagement in education and pupil inclusion' across Blackpool.

The submissions were evaluated by a panel consisting of representatives from the Council's School Improvement Service, the Opportunity Area Programme, Blackpool Secondary Schools and from the Department for Education. The process was facilitated by the Council's Procurement Team.
