Bispham Ward

1. Crawford Avenue

Traffic management received a request from the Westcliff Primary Academy to extend the time limit on the yellow school zig zags on Crawford Avenue. This was due to before and after school clubs starting earlier and finishing later than the current restrictions. Following investigation officers proposed the following restriction.

Bloomfield Ward

1. Crystal Road

Traffic management received resident complaints about vehicles parking to close to the exit of Crystal Mews making it hard to get out of the small close. Following investigation Officers proposed the following restrictions.

2. Maudland Road

Traffic management received complaints from residents after double yellow lines were removed from both sides of the road to allow parking on both side, residents said that the gap between the vehicles was too narrow. After investigation officers proposed to reinstate the double yellow lines.

3. Baron Road

4. Adrian Street

Traffic management received complaints from residents regards vehicles parking in the space between the double yellow lines. A number of years ago there was a warehouse on Adrian Street and to help with the business the double yellow lines were stopped either side of their warehouse upon investigation that business had closed down and the warehouse wasn't in use. Traffic management officers decided

to join the double yellow lines up.

4. Queen Street

Traffic management received complaints from the police regards people parking in the police bays at the end of Queen Street. This also effected the disabled bay at the same location. After Investigation officers noticed the times on the sign were wrong. The following restrictions were proposed.

Clifton Ward

1. Rusland Avenue

Traffic management received complaints from a resident of the small cul-de-sac off Rusland Avenue (also called Rusland Avenue) that the road was too narrow to park cars on the road plus vehicles were parking in the turning circle at the end. Following investigations Officer propose the following restriction.

1. Tarragon Drive

A H bar had been placed in front of these dropped crossings, however no other restrictions were in place and the crossing patrol was finding it difficult to see when the road was safe to step into to stop the traffic. After investigation officers proposed the following restriction.

Traffic management had received enquiries about creating a new limited waiting bay near the café on Squires Gate Lane. After investigation officers decided that Marple Close provided the best location.

Traffic management received complaints about lack of parking on Mayfield Avenue due to the fact that there was a single yellow line down one side of the road. After investigation officers decided to remove the yellow line and free up more parking.

1. Carterville Close

Traffic management received complaints from residents of Caterville Close regards vehicles parking in the turning circle at the end of the cul-de-sac. There is also a caravan parked there as well. After investigations Officers propose the following restriction.

In this batch order we have revoked the order for the lines.
