I am objecting to the license change next door to me for the following reasons: I have 2 children, a 4 year old and a 5 month old, both our bedrooms are directly next door to the bar area. Some weekends the children can't sleep till the music finishes early hours in the morning. I am currently on maternity leave but will be returning to work in September and my eldest will be starting School. The music can be very loud and I worry that if it is going to be as loud and as late on week days this will affect her whilst at school and me at work.

There is also a family that has just moved in with a young child and other people in the building that have to be up early for work this will affect them too. It will also cause a lot of noise when the bar closes, there will be people lingering around outside my flat and other hotels on the street whilst waiting for taxis etc. There is plenty of bars and clubs in blackpool with late licensers 7 days a week, I don't feel there is the need for another.
