Locally commissioned employment services ensure that people with autism have the opportunity to access employment opportunities. Additionally, a locally commissioned service is specific for people with autism to teach them work related skills and help them to move on to employment.

Transition processes to adult services have an employment focus. Part of the assessment during the period of transition considers work placements during time in school, information and advice and guidance and finding the right environment for people to work. Young people have informed adult commissioners that they value the work completed regarding employment during the transition period. Project Search will also be a new option for young people from September 2014.
