Blackpool council's aim is for people living with dementia to feel safe within their homes and their town. This will be achieved through training and education on a large scale, ensuring as many organisations, providers services, schools have access to the dementia friends training.

# 2. What are the challenges to delivering these outcomes from the perspective of your organisation?

People over the age of 65 contribute to nearly 20% (19.63%) of the Blackpool population. It is predicted that by 2020, 2,172 people over the age of 65 will have dementia. It is vital that we equip as many individuals with the knowledge and tools to support those living with dementia and those that care for them.
