1.1 To consider an application for a new premises licence for KP Stores, 326 Talbot Road, and the relevant representations submitted by Lancashire Constabulary and Public Health

4.0 Background Information

4.1 Application

On 4th July 2014, the Licensing Service received an application for a premises licence at KP Stores, 326 Talbot Road Blackpool. Permission is sought to sell alcohol for consumption off the premises 07.00 - 23.30 daily.

The application has been submitted by Prabaharan Thirunavukkarasu

4.2 Local policy considerations

This premises is in Claremont Ward which is part of the off licence saturation area. This creates a presumption that the application will be refused. To rebut this presumption, the applicant is expected to show through the operating schedule, and where appropriate with supporting evidence, that the operation of the premises will not add to the cumulative impact already being experienced.

The statement of licensing policy also goes on to say that applicants for licences within the off-licence saturation area will be expected to cover the issues detailed below in their operating schedule. Failure to do so may result in refusal of the application:

1. Details of the proof of age scheme to be implemented and proposals for staff training;
2. Percentage of premises to be used for the sale of alcohol, including details of other items to be sold;
3. The applicant's policy on the sale of low value/high alcohol products and any drinks discounting that would be adopted.

4.3 National policy considerations

4.4 Observations

This premises was previously licensed as Shop locally. This licence was revoked at a review hearing on 17th December 2013. The licence holder at that time was Mr Kesayaraj.

A licensing panel considered an application for a new licence at a hearing on 24th March 2014. This application was submitted by Mr Thirunavukkarasu, the current applicant. The reasons for refusing this application are detailed below:

“This is an application for a premises licence in an area subject to the off licence saturation policy. In these circumstances the panel should only grant the application if the applicant demonstrates that the granting of the licence would not adversely impact on the licensing objectives.

The applicant and proposed Designated Premises Supervisor appears to have some experience in the retail trade but was only granted a personal licence at the beginning of February 2014. This is a new business for him and the panel are concerned about his lack of experience, particularly with a premise in the saturation zone, an area already deemed to be suffering from alcohol related problems.

The applicant produced a list of conditions provided to them by the Police – they agree to them all with the exception of a condition prohibiting the sale of beer and cider in single cans. The applicant relies on the fact that the premises had been licensed for 30 years before it was revoked in December 2013 as a reason for granting today’s application.

Taking all of the evidence put before them the panel were of the view that they had not been satisfied that the granting of this licence would not add to existing cumulative impact. The application is therefore refused.”

These retail shop premises are situated on a main road in an area comprising of residential and commercial/industrial premises. The area generally is not well served by premises selling alcohol for off premises consumption and therefore demonstrates a need in this particular locality. The premises are well run and managed by an experienced retailer. The premises previously had the benefit of a Premises Licence for off premises sale of alcohol but that Licence was revoked by the Authority due to poor management and various Statutory breaches. The current applicant is unconnected with previous owners and can demonstrate that he has applied a "clean brush" to the premises and will be able to promote all the licensing objectives to a very high standard, the details of which appear below. The granting of the application (with conditions) will not add to existing cumulative impact.

b) The prevention of crime and disorder

1. State of the art CCTV is installed with multi-screen remote live access and instant memory access. Multi cameras cover all public areas of the shop premises, including the entry/exit. The system internal memory records for a period of at least 31 days. The DPS and all staff are fully trained to operate the system.

2. An incident book will record any incidents of crime and disorder, any refused sales, any person refused admission or asked to leave and details of any occasions when the Police are called to the premises.

c) Public safety

The premises maintain a high standard of safety compliance and will continue to carry out regular Health & Safety checks in respect of all parts of the building structure, isles and walkways, electrical compliance and a record will be kept of all maintenance issues and risk assessments.

d) The prevention of public nuisance

A clear, legible and conspicuous notice will remind all patrons to respect local residents and to curtail noise or behavior likely to lead to disturbance

e) The protection of children from harm

The licence holder will support and rigorously enforce Challenge 25 Proof of age policy. All staff will be fully trained on under age sales, and compliance with the other licensing objectives, and a full training record will be kept on the premises, and be available for inspection by an appropriate official. Staff training will be updated every 3 months. An authorised personnel list shall be kept, signed and dated by the DPS. No sales of alcohol will be made by any person under age 18 and all sales of alcohol will be made or authorised by a personal licence holder. A refusals register will be maintained fully up to date at the premises and made available for appropriate inspection.

Reasons for making representations				
<p>I am in receipt of an application for a New Premises Licence for the above address.</p> <p>On behalf of the Chief Officer of Police, having reviewed the application the Police make formal objections on the following grounds:</p> <p>The Police base this objection on the existing Premises Licence being within the Off Licence Saturation Policy Area. The purpose of this Policy is to limit the number of Off Licensed Premises within a given geographic area, in order to reduce crime and disorder and promote the licensing objectives. The Policy sets out the following;</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The number, type and density of the premises selling alcohol in a particular area can lead to serious problems of nuisance and disorder. In these circumstances the impact of the premises taken as a whole can be far greater than that arising from individual premises. In most cases it would be impossible to identify an 				

individual premise as being the sole cause or major contributing factor.

- The potential impact on the promotion of the licensing objections by a significant number of licensed premises concentrated in one area is called cumulative impact. The cumulative impact of all the premises in an area upon the promotion of the licensing objectives is a proper matter for the Licensing Committee to consider.
- This application is within the saturation zone. The location of the proposed premises is on the outskirts of the town, servicing both the day time and night time economy. These premises will only add to the availability of alcohol and increase crime and disorder.

These Premises went to a Review Hearing earlier in the year whereby the previous licence held at the premises was revoked. When this is combined with the fact that the premises is in a Saturation Zone, I do not believe a licence should be effectively re-instated, albeit under a different name.

I also have concerns that the Licence Holder/Designated Premises Supervisor has only undertaken his Personal Licence Course in the past 6 months and although he has been running the business since February this is without an alcohol licence and therefore would be his first role as a DPS and he may not be suitable to take on a high risk premises.

A hearing would allow the Licensing Committee to examine the prospective operators' intentions and rebut the presumption that the operation of the premises will not add to the cumulative impact and therefore crime and disorder.

It is recommended that the licence should only be granted if the application is amended, or if conditions are applied, as detailed below.

Reasons for making representations

I write in reference to the new Premises Licence application for the KP Store.

Following review of this application, Public Health, Blackpool Council, make a formal objection on the following grounds:

- This application is within the Off Licence Saturation Policy Area.

Blackpool Council's Statement of Licensing Policy 2011 -2014 states:

3.10 Cumulative Impact

3.10.1 General

- The number, type and density of premises selling alcohol in a particular area can lead to serious problems of nuisance or disorder. In these circumstances the impact of the premises taken as a whole can be far greater than that arising from individual premises. In most cases it would be impossible to identify individual premises as being the sole cause or major

contributing factor.

- The potential impact on the promotion of the licensing objectives by a significant number of licensed premises concentrated in one area is called “cumulative impact”. This is not to be confused with “need” for premises in an area, which the Licensing Committee cannot take into account when determining applications. The cumulative impact of all the premises in an area upon the promotion of the Licensing Objectives is a proper matter for the licensing authority to consider.

In addition, health related data from Public Health England (Local Health) provides evidence that the area around this premises has a significantly higher number of hospital stays for alcohol related harm (SAR) than the national average (England).

It is recommended that the licence should only be granted if the application is amended, or if conditions are applied, as detailed below.
