APPLICATION FOR A PREMISES LICENCE – Bella Pizza

1.0 Purpose of the report:

1.1 To consider an application for a premises licence at Bella Pizza, 89 Dickson Road Blackpool.

2.0 Recommendation(s):

2.1 The panel are requested to consider the application and determine whether the granting of this licence would adversely impact on the licensing objectives.

- 3.1 Representations have been received therefore there must be a hearing to determine the application.

- 3.2b Is the recommendation in accordance with the Council's approved Yes budget?
- 3.3 Other alternative options to be considered:

4.0 **Background Information**

- 4.1 On 28th May 2015, the licensing service received an application from Hossin Shojaeeto issue a premises licence at Bella Pizza, 89 Dickson Road Blackpool Council.
- 4.2 The application requests permission to provide late night refreshment Sunday-Thursday 23.00 -0 01.00, Friday-Saturday 23.00 – 02.00. A copy of the application is attached at Appendix 4a.

- 4.3 Representations have been received from Health and Safety. A copy of the representation is attached.
- 4.4 Local policy considerations
 None

National policy considerations

9.36 – as a matter of practice, licensing authorities should seek to focus the hearing on the steps considered appropriate to promote the particular licensing objective or objectives that have given rise to the specific representation and avoid straying into undisputed areas

- 9.41 licensing authorities are best placed to determine what actions are appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives in their areas. All licensing determinations should be considered on a case by case basis.
- 9.42 the authority's determination should be evidence-based, justified as being appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives and proportionate to what it is intended to achieve.
- 9.43 determination of whether an action or step is appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives requires an assessment of what action or step would be suitable to achieve that end. Whilst this does not therefore require a licensing authority to decide that no lesser step will achieve the aim, the authority should aim to consider the potential burden that the condition would impose on the premises licence holder (such as the financial burden due to restrictions on licensable activities) as well as the potential benefit in terms of the promotion of the licensing objectives. However, it is imperative that the authority ensures that the factors which form the basis of its determination are limited to consideration of the promotion of the objectives and nothing outside those parameters.

4.5 Observations

Lancashire Constabulary have agreed a number of conditions with the applicant that will be added to the licence if it is granted:

- 1. CCTV, which complies with the following criteria, will be installed at the premises.
 - a. The CCTV system shall be installed, maintained and operated to the reasonable satisfaction of Lancashire Constabulary.
 - b. The system shall display on any recording the correct time and date of

the recording;

- c. The system shall be recording during all hours the premises are open to the public;
- d. VCR tapes or digital recording shall be held for a minimum of 28 days after the recording is made and will be made available to the Police for inspection upon request.
- e. The system shall, as a minimum, record images of the head and shoulders of all persons entering the premises.
- f. A staff member who is conversant with the operation of the CCTV system will be on the premises at all times that the premises are open to the public. This staff member will be able to show police, or any officer acting for a Responsible Authority, recent data or footage with the absolute minimum of delay when requested.
- 2. The licence holder shall notify the Police Licensing Unit on any occasion when the CCTV is to be inoperative for a period in excess of one working day and shall provide a certificate from a competent person stating the reason for the system being inoperative and the measures which have been taken to satisfy the licence conditions.
- 3. Appropriate signage alerting customers to CCTV recording shall be displayed in conspicuous positions on the premises.
- 4. The premises have installed a wall-mounted screen, no smaller than 32", mounted in a prominent position within the premises, so that patrons can view live-recorded CCTV footage.
- 5. There will be no boxing machines in operation in the premises.
- Risk assessments carried out by or on behalf of the Licence Holder which
 relate to a licensing objective will be available for inspection by an officer or a
 responsible authority.
- 7. No persons under the age of 16 will be allowed on the premises after 23.00.
- 8. There will be fixed seating in the premises for the benefit of customers
- 9. An efficient queuing system will be in operation and the licence holder will arrange adequate supervision of any queue to prevent disorderly behaviour.

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

Throughout 2013 the Health and Safety Enforcement section have been carrying out spot checks on electrical installations this has included some joint working with Electricity Northwest.


During inspection of premises it has come to light that the electrical installation on this premise was tampered with in order to abstract electric.

Meter tampering is a criminal offence and in this case rendered the electrical system as extremely dangerous including the electrical system that fed the upstairs flat where a couple lived with their baby.

The Electricity Northwest officer Joseph Taylor outlines his findings in his statement below.

THIS IS EXTREMELY DANGEROUS AS IF THERE IS A BREAK IN THE EARTH CONNECTION THE METALWORK (IE: - COOKING RANGE) AND THE UPSTAIRS FLAT WILL BECOME LIVE. I removed the by-pass/meter (delete as appropriate) (Ref. No......) and fitted a new meter. The electricity supply was left "OFF" SUAPLY AND RESERVED. The meter/evidence associated with this job was placed into an evidence bag then later stored in our secure area located at BLACKBURN DEPOT. NO PERSON HAS ANY RIGHT OR AUTHORITY TO TAMPER OR INTERFERE WITH ANY METERS AND EQUIPMENT BELONGING TO ELECTRICITY NORTHWEST LIMITED. Statement Taken by (rank/PIN/name).

Karen Ainsworth, revenue protection manager for Electricity North West, comments below:

"We take meter tampering very seriously and electricity abstraction is a criminal offence and puts the safety of tenants, businesses and the general public at great risk.

"We will continue to crack down on local businesses as it is unacceptable that honest bill-paying residents across the North West are effectively having to pay for others to have free electricity."

In addition to the electrical issues Mark Marshall, Licensing and Health and Safety Manager outlines in the statement below his dealings with the premise in relation to operating whilst the licence for the premise is suspended.

I am Mark Marshall and I am currently employed as a Licensing and Health and Safety Manager for Blackpool Council. On Friday 25th October 2013 I was on duty checking premises on the 'suspended list'. The suspended list is a list of premises that have failed to pay their annual renewal fees. In accordance with the legislation the premises are advised 21 days before the suspension is due to effect in writing. They are clearly told that if the fee is paid within the 21 days then the suspension will not take effect. At 23.20 I visited 89 Dickson Road, which is recorded on the licensing system as Nelsons Chip Shop, The premises license was suspended on the 24th September 2013, I month prior to my visit. I went into the premises at which point I saw 2 customers inside. One male was being served with food as I entered and I saw a cash exchange for the goods. The next male who I would describe as in him mid 60's wearing smart clothes was waiting for his order which was clearly on the hot plate behind the counter. 2 males were behind the counter, I asked who was in charge and neither of the males took responsibility. I asked to see the license which indicated that Nasser Mahdavi was the License holder.

On the **2**nd **of February 2015** in company with officer Lloyd Anderson I visited as I had noted staff smoking in the rear of the premise on entering the staff rushed to the rear of the premise and there evidence of smoking into a bin the operator was formerly warned about the need to work with authorities and also in relation to smoking legislation on the night. As we were leaving the premise a customer took offence at me issuing this warning and became extremely verbally abusive to the point myself and officer Lloyd had to retreat some distance from the property with the offender continuing his abuse all the way and it wasn't for some time until the operators and his staff came to our assistance. Fortunately we were able to leave without the incident escalating to physical violence.

After receiving this licence application Officer Jacqui Harrison visits and noted the following.

Filters on extraction missing and this is directly above flats.

Last electrical certification only relates to a dead test after the meter was taken out and no further checks have been made before continuing operations of the business.

Gas equipment not included on the gas safety certification.

Operator unable to confirm what hot water system was in place. Historically this has always been a gas system from the upstairs flat and again this was not included on the current gas safety certification.

Conclusion

I have concerns about the level of management in relation to safety and have seen little produced to reassure me that this premise will do anything other than continue to operate on a reactive basis rather than being proactive.
