1.0 Purpose of the report:

1.1 To consider an application for a Premises Licence in respect of The Stone Grill, 272-274 Queens Promenade.

4.0 **Background Information**

4.1 On 4 March 2016, the Licensing Service received an application from David Paul Davies for the grant of a Premises Licence for the Stone Grill, 272-274 Queens Promenade.

- 4.2 The application requests a Premises Licence giving permission for live music, recorded music, entertainment of a similar description and the sale of alcohol for consumption on the premises 11.00 00.00 in addition to late night refreshment 23.00 00.00. all activities to be permitted until 02.00 on New Year's Eve. A copy of the application is attached at Appendix 4a.
- 4.3 Representations have been received from members of the public. Copies of the representations are attached at Appendix 4b.

4.5 National policy considerations

9.42 – The authority's decision should be evidence-based, justified as being appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives and proportionate to what it is intended to achieve.

9.43 – Determination of whether an action or step is appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives requires an assessment of what action or step would be suitable to achieve that end. Whilst this does not therefore require a licensing authority to decide that no lesser step will achieve the aim, the authority should aim to consider the potential burden that the condition would impose on the premises licence holder as well as the potential benefit in terms of promotion of the licensing objectives. However, it is imperative that the authority ensures that the factors which form the basis of its determination are limited to consideration of the promotion of the licensing objectives and nothing outside those parameters.

4.6 **Observations**

This premises was previously licensed under the name Belgrave Madison from 2005 until the licence was surrendered in July 2014. The hotel was licensed prior to this by the Magistrates' Court. The previous licence authorised similar activities with identical hours to those requested in this application.

- 1. The restrictions on the times during which the licence authorises the sale by retail of alcohol on the premises set out in section of J of the Licensable activities section of this licence shall not prohibit:
- A. During the first 30 minutes after the above hours the consumption of the alcohol on the premises
- B. During first 30 minutes after the above hours the taking of the alcohol from the premises provided that it is not supplied or taken in an open vessel of the first 30 minutes of the character the character the consumption of the
- C. During the first 30 minutes after the above hours the consumption of the alcohol on the premises by persons taking table meals if the alcohol was supplied for consumption as ancillary to the meals.
- D. Consumption of alcohol on the premises by any person residing there or their bona fide guests
- E. The supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises to persons employed there for the purposes of the business carried on by the licence holder if supplied at the expense of the licence holder.

Conditions consistent with the Operating Schedule

- 1. CCTV will be installed internally and externally at the premises and will comply with the following: -
 - The CCTV system shall be installed, maintained and operated to the reasonable satisfaction of Lancashire Constabulary. All public areas of the premises are to be covered by the system.
 - The system will display on any recording the correct time and date of the recording.
 - The system will make recordings during all hours that the premises are open to the public.

- The VCR tapes or digital recording will be held for a minimum of 31 days and 28 days respectively after the recording is made and will be made available to the police or any authorized persons acting for a responsible authority for inspection upon request.
- The system will, as a minimum, record images of the head and shoulders of all persons entering the premises.

A staff member who is conversant with the operation of the CCTV system will be on the premises at all times that the premises are open to the public. This staff member will be able to show police recent data or footage with the absolute minimum of delay, when requested.

The Licence Holder or Designated Premises Supervisor will notify the Police Licensing Unit on any occasion when the CCTV is to be inoperative for a period in excess of one working day and shall provide a certificate from a competent person stating the reason for the system being inoperative and the measures which have been taken to satisfy the licence conditions.

Appropriate signs informing customers that CCTV is recording will be displayed in conspicuous positions on the premises.


Monthly documented maintenance checks of the CCTV system, including the recording system, will be carried out by the Designated Premisies Supervisor to ensure that the system is in good working order and fit for purpose.

- 2. The Local Authority CCTV control room will be notified: -
- a) on any occasion when the premises CCTV or radio system is inoperative
- a) when the CCTV or radio system has been brought back into use.
- 3. Clear legible and conspicuous notices requesting patrons to avoid causing noise, nuisance or disturbance to local residents shall be displayed at every exit.
- 4. Only toughened glass vessels are used to dispense beverages to customers.

- 5. Noise from any regulated entertainment shall not exceed the background noise levels at the nearest sensitive premises or at the discretion of the Local Authority some other prearranged level.
- 6. The licence holder and designated premises supervisor are to support and rigorously enforce the Challenge 21 proof of age policy. Any person who looks or appears to be under the age of 21 shall be asked to provide identification that they are over the age of 21.
- 7. Any person who looks or appears to be under the age of 21 shall be asked to provide identification that they are over the age of 18. The following are the only forms of identification acceptable: -
- i. UK photo driving licence
- ii. Passport
- iii. Proof of Age Standards Scheme card.
- 8. All members of staff are to have received suitable training in relation to the proof of age scheme to be applied upon the premises. All members of staff are to receive regular refresher training at intervals of a maximum of six months. Records to evidence this will be made available to an authorised officer upon request.
- 9. A refusals book will be kept and maintained in the bar area.
- 10. Persons under the age of 14 shall not be allowed in the bar areas of the licenced premises during the permitted hours unless accompanied by an adult over the age of 18.
- 11. Clear and conspicuous notices shall be displayed in the bar area of the premises indicating that it is unlawful for persons under the age of 18 to purchase alcohol or for any person to purchase alcohol on behalf of a person under 18 years of age.
- 12. At least one personal licence holder shall be available while the sale or supply of alcohol is being undertaken. That person's identity will be notified to all other staff engaged in the sale or supply of alcohol.

- 13. In the absence of the Designated Premises Supervisor another person shall be nominated to deputise for the Designated Premises Supervisor and that person's identity will be notified to all other staff when such absence occurs.
- 14. Frequent collection of glasses and bottles will be undertaken to ensure that empty containers do not accumulate on or around the licensed premises.
- 15. Save for residents and their bona fide guests and those attending functions or taking table meals alcohol will not be supplied to any person.
- 16. Free cold drinking water will be available on request and there will be adequate supplies of chilled soft drinks and bottled water available for sale at the bar.
- 17. The Licence Holder shall ensure that staff arriving before 09:00 or leaving late at night when the premises have ceased trading conduct themselves in such a manner as to avoid disturbance to local residents and neighbours.
- 18. The placing of refuse such as bottles shall take place between 08:00 and 22:00 so as to avoid causing disturbance to nearby premises.
- 19. Noise from any regulated entertainment, mechanical ventilation or refrigeration plant shall not exceed background levels at the nearest sensitive properties or, at the discretion of the Local Authority, shall not exceed some other pre-agreed limit, which does not cause unreasonable disturbance to the residents of those properties or their guests.
- 20. The volume of amplified sound used in connection with any regulated entertainment shall at all times be under the control of the licence holder or management and the controlling mechanism shall be operated from a part of the premises inaccessible to the public.
- 21. All external windows and doors shall be closed during hours of any regulated entertainment except in the event of an emergency and save for the purposes of access and egress.

- 22. The Licence Holder shall ensure that noise or vibration shall not emanate from the premises such as to cause disturbance to persons in the neighbourhood.
- 23. No entertainment of an "adult" or "sexual" nature will take place on the premises.
- 24. The premises licence holder shall ensure that cooking, noxious or persistent smells generated at the premises do not cause nuisance to properties within close proximity.
- 25. The Premises shall be operated in accordance with the principles outlined by the Nightsafe initiative as set out in the associated leaflet and as are relevant to the Premises.
- 26. On New Year's Eve the permitted hours for the activities E, F, H, I, and J shall be extended until 0200 on New Year's Day morning.

We wish to register our objection to the application for a premises licence by Stone Grill, 270-274 Queens Promenade, Blackpool. The basis for this opposition is that granting a licence for these premises will not promote the licensing objectives, particularly the prevention of public nuisance and crime and disorder.

application for stone grill 270-274 Queens Promenade Blackpool

1) Objection- prevention of public nuisance.

The property is in a residential location and the live entertainment/music and selling of alcohol up to midnight daily and later on New Years Eve will adversely affect local residents causing considerable distress and noise creating a public nuisance.

During summer months as the licence application is until midnight and the early hours on New Years Eve, all noise from the hotel will carry due to windows being open. In addition, the noise from the outdoors smoking area will also cause disturbance to residents.

Is there an operational condition within the application to keep all the windows closed until midnight? What will happen on hot humid nights when someone is bound to want to open a window?

Is the owner also proposing as a condition to install air conditioning, if so where will the air conditioning plant for that go? Do they have planning consent for this?

2) objection - prevention of crime and disorder

The supply of alcohol until midnight may well subject local residents to anti social behavior and noise.

There may be an increase in local crime and public disorder with customers leaving the premises after midnight in a residential area

The area is normally very quiet during the early hours of the morning and in particular any arrivals or departures after midnight will cause a disturbance.

I am also concerned about the potential for damage to property if customers are allowed to leave in the early hours of the morning, having drunk significant quantities of alcohol

In conclusion, we strongly oppose this application for the supply of alcohol daily until midnight.

Dear Sirs,

We are writing to object to the new premises licence application applied for by David Paul Davies for a venue called The Stone Grill at 272-274 Queen's Promenade, FY2 9HD.

Our objections to the application are as follows:

This establishment would be in what is a residential block with families and children; residents and non-residents entering and leaving up to and beyond midnight every night would create an increase in noise levels and disturbance at unacceptable times of the night. It is highly surprising that such a late licence could be considered at all in a completely residential area, and for seven nights of the week.

With the consumption of alcohol at 272-274 Queen's Promenade being some distance from the main entertainment area of Red Bank Road, the police would have to cover a wider area for drink related crime that the risk of this establishment poses, be it anti-social behaviour, violent conduct, or property/car damage. Do we really need people on the streets in a quiet residential area that at the moment needs little policing?

Has the impact of increased traffic and parking been considered as there seems to be insufficient parking available on the forecourt of 272-274 Queen's Promenade which will lead to parking chaos on the promenade and neighbouring streets, with customers possibly parking in the bus stop making it difficult for local residents to board buses and making it a hazard for buses to stop there. During promenade events (running races, car rallies, etc.) and throughout the Illuminations period, the parking on Queen's Promenade and streets off it are chaotic with many drivers giving little thought to pedestrian safety or preventing local residents' access to their properties – opening a public restaurant will only add to the problem.

We are particularly worried about the wording 'Provision for live and recorded music and associated entertainment to midnight Monday to Sunday' and 'Late Night Refreshment from 2300 hours to midnight Monday to Sunday' – again we feel these times are unacceptable in a residential area made up mainly of families with children who need as much sleep as possible.


Will there be a smoking shelter erected for customers and staff? With residential properties on three sides this poses a public nuisance and an issue for protecting children from harm; many playgrounds and parks across Blackpool are smoke-free zones – surely our gardens deserve the same protection?

We understand that the property was previously a hotel, but the provision of food, alcohol, and entertainment to the general public changes the nature of the building and the surrounding area; before the consumption of alcohol would only have been by residents, but this licence will grant anybody the chance to leave the premises intoxicated, and that changes the nature of the promenade, creating a 'new area of entertainment' that is not needed.

We feel that granting a licence to this establishment would be severely detrimental to the surrounding area. There would be increased noise pollution, and a negative impact on the licensing

objectives, particularly the prevention of crime, disorder, and antisocial behaviour, posing a public safety risk in what is currently a quiet residential family area.
