APPLICATION FOR A PREMISES LICENCE – Bolton Newsagents

1.0 Purpose of the report:

1.1 To consider an application for a Premises Licence at Bolton Newsagents, 90-92 Bolton Street.

2.0 Recommendation(s):

2.1 The panel is requested to consider the application and determine whether the granting of this licence would adversely impact on the Licensing Objectives.

3.0 Reasons for recommendation(s):

3.1 Representations have been received therefore there must be a hearing to determine the application.

None, once an application is submitted and representations received it must be considered by the Licensing Panel.

4.0 Background Information

4.1 On 9th June 2016 2016, the Licensing Service received an application from KPT Food and Wine Limited for a Premises Licence at Bolton Newsagents, 90-92 Bolton Street.

4.2 The application requests permission to sell alcohol for consumption off the premises 10.00 – 23.00 hours daily. A copy of the application is attached at Appendix 4a.

4.3 Representations have been received from Lancashire Constabulary and Public Health. Copies of the representations are attached at Appendix 4b and 4c.

4.4 **Local policy considerations**

This premises is situated within Bloomfield Ward which is one for four wards that form part of the off-licence saturation policy. The effect of this policy is to create a rebuttable presumption that applications will be refused. To rebut this presumption, an applicant would be expected to show through the operating schedule, and where appropriate with supporting evidence, that the operation of the premises will not add to the cumulative impact already being experienced. The following sections of the policy are relevant:

4.8.3 This policy does not act as an absolute prohibition on the granting of new off licences however, the policy will only be overridden in genuinely exceptional cases where the applicant can demonstrate that the granting of the application will not undermine the policy and the reasons for it.

4.8.4 An application is not likely to be classed as exceptional merely on the ground that the premises have been or will be operated within the terms of its licence or that they are/will be well managed. This is to be expected of any application.

4.5 **National policy considerations**

9.12 – The police are an essential source of advice and information on the impact and potential impact of licensable activities, particularly on the crime and disorder objective. The licensing authority should accept all reasonable and proportionate representations made by the police unless the authority has evidence that do so would not be proportionate for the promotion of the licensing objectives.

9.42 – The authority's decision should be evidence-based, justified as being appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives and proportionate to what it is intended to achieve.

13.35 – After receiving relevant representations in relation to a new application for or a variation of a licence or certificate, the licensing authority must consider whether it would be justified in departing from its special policy in the light of the individual circumstances of the case... if the Licensing Authority decides that an application should be refused, it will still need to show that the grant of the application would undermine the promotion of one of the licensing objectives and that appropriate conditions would be ineffective in preventing the problems involved.

4.6 **Observations**

This shop was previously licensed for the sale of alcohol for consumption off the premises. This licence was revoked at a review hearing in June 2014 due to a failed test purchase and poor management. The shop was under different management at that time. The licence holder appealed the decision to the Magistrates' Court. The decision to revoke was upheld at a hearing on 15 October 2014.

4.7 An application for a new Premises Licence by Puventhirarajan Nadarajah was refused by the Licensing Panel at a hearing on 23 September 2015.

4.8 An application by Pratheep Kanagarasa was refused on 29 March 2016. Mr Kanagarasa is the sole director of the company KPT Food and Wine Limited and the proposed Designated Premises Supervisor. Since that date Mr Kanagarasa has submitted Temporary Event Notices to authorise the sale of alcohol for consumption off the premises on the following dates:

22 – 24 April 2016

28 April - 2 May 2016

13 May 2016

27 – 30 May 2016

9-12 June 2016.

IN ADDITION ALL PERSONS SELLING ALCOHOL WOULD HOLD A PERSONAL LICENCE

THE FOLLOWING CONDITIONS TO BE ADDED TO THE LICENCE

- 1) INCIDENT BOOK TO BE KEPT AND MADE AVAILABLE TO THE RESPONSIBLE AUTHORITIES WHEN REQUESTED AT THE PREMISES

ALL STAFF TO BE TRAINED IN RELATION TO UNDERAGE SALES AND CHALLENGE 25, AND MADE FULLY AWARE OF THEIR RESPONSIBILITIES IN RELATION TO VERIFYING THE AGES OF CUSTOMERS AND TO BE ABLE TO QUESTION POTENTIAL UNDERAGE CUSTOMERS WHO MAY ATTEMPT TO PURCHASE ALCOHOL AND THE USE OF THE REFUSALS BOOK AND INCIDENT LOG. THE REFUSALS BOOKS TO CONTAIN DETAILS OF TIME AND DATE, DESCRIPTION OF THE ATTEMPTING PURCHASER, DESCRIPTION OF THE AGE RESTRICTED PRODUCTS THEY ATTEMPTED TO PURCHASE, REASONS WHY THE SALE WAS REFUSED AND THE NAME/SIGNATURE OF THE SALES PERSON REFUSING THE SALE.

4) ALL STAFF TO BE TRAINED IN THE USE OF THE REFUSAL BOOKS
THE REFUSALS BOOK AND INCIDENT BOOK TO BE EXAMINED ON A REGULAR BASIS (AT LEAST WEEKLY) BY THE LICENSEE or dps AND DATE AND TIME OF EACH EXAMINATION TO BE ENDORSED IN THE BOOK. ANALYSIS OF STAFF REFUSALS AND DATA SUCH AS THE TIME/DAY OF REFUSALS TO BE CARRIED OUT BY THE LICENSEE OR DPS ON A REGULAR BASIS(AT LEAST WEEKLY)

5) THE LICENCE HOLDER SHALL ENSURE THAT A CCTV SYSTEM IS INSTALLED AT THE PREMISES OF EVIDENTIAL STANDARD ACCEPTABLE TO POLICE. THE SYSTEM SHALL BE MAINTAINED IN GOOD WORKING ORDER AND FULLY OPERATIONAL COVERING ALL INTERNAL AREAS OF THE PREMISES TO WHICH THE PUBLIC HAVE ACCESS AND ALSO THE AREA IMMEDIATELY OUTSIDE THE PREMISES. ENTRY POINT SHALL BE COVERED ENABLING FRONTAL IDENTIFICATION (FULL HEAD AND SHOULDERS IMAGES) OF EVERY PERSON ENTERING THE PREMISES IN ANY LIGHT CONDITION TO AN EVIDENTIAL STANDARD. EXTERNAL CAMERAS WILL BE INSTALLED

6) MANAGEMENT AND PERMANENT MEMBERS OF STAFF WILL BE TRAINED IN THE OPERATION OF THE SYSTEM WITH AT LEAST ONE MEMBER STAFF ON DUTY EACH DAY WHO IS ABLE TO DOWNLOAD IMAGES FROM THE CCTV SYSTEM

7) THE CCTV SYSTEM WILL HAVE THE CAPABILITY TO EITHER DOWNLOAD FOOTAGE ONTO DISC OR MEMORY STICK. THE FOOTAGE ON THE CCTV SYSTEM WILL BE RETAINED FOR A MINIMUM PERIOD OF 31 DAYS BEFORE RE-WRITING ITSELF WITH CORRECT DATE AND TIME SHOWING. THE FOOTAGE SHALL BE MADE AVAILABLE TO POLICE OR LOCAL AUTHORITY OFFICERS UPON REQUEST. IMAGES SHOULD BE ABLE TO BE REPLAYED ON A COMPUTER

8) PERSON CONVERSANT WITH DOWNLOADING IMAGES SHOULD BE ON THE PREMISES

9) IF THE CCTV SYSTEM IS BROKEN THE LICENCE HOLDER SHALL NOTIFY THE LICENSING AUTHORITY IMMEDIATELY AND GET THE FAULT RECTIFIED AS SOON AS PRACTICABLE. SUSPENSION OF LICENSABLE ACTIVITY IF LICENSING AUTHORITY SO WISH UNTIL SYSTEM REPAIRED.

10) THE LICENCE HOLDER SHALL ENSURE THAT A LOG IS KEPT WITH DETAILS OF THE DATES OF ALL WORK/REPAIRS CARRIED OUT ON THE CCTV SYSTEM INCLUDING THE NAME AND PHONE NUMBER OF THE ENGINEER. CCTV WILL BE INSPECTED DAILY TO ASCERTAIN THAT IT IS WORKING CORRECTLY AND LOG KEPT OF THIS

11) THE CCTV CAMERAS VIEWS ARE NOT TO BE OBSTRUCTED

<p>I am in receipt of an application for a New Premises Licence for the above address.</p> <p>On behalf of the Chief Officer of Police, having reviewed the application the Police make formal objections on the following grounds:</p> <p>The Police base this objection on the existing Premises Licence being within the Off Licence Saturation Policy Area. The purpose of this Policy is to limit the number of Off Licensed Premises within a given geographic area, in order to reduce crime and disorder and promote the licensing objectives. The Policy sets out the following;</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> The number, type and density of the premises selling alcohol in a particular area can lead to serious problems of nuisance and disorder. In these circumstances the impact of the premises taken as a whole can be far greater than that arising from individual premises. In most cases it would be impossible to identify an 				

individual premise as being the sole cause or major contributing factor.

- The potential impact on the promotion of the licensing objections by a significant number of licensed premises concentrated in one area is called cumulative impact. The cumulative impact of all the premises in an area upon the promotion of the licensing objectives is a proper matter for the Licensing Committee to consider.
- This application is within the saturation zone. The location of the proposed premises is on the outskirts of the town, servicing both the day time and night time economy. These premises will only add to the availability of alcohol and increase crime and disorder.

The proposed new premises falls within the Bloomfield area of Blackpool, which is surrounded by HMO, Hotels, Holiday Flats, Residential houses and numerous business premises most of these with an alcohol licence.

The Bloomfield Ward already consists of 23 premises that are Off Licences this is not including the other premises with an alcohol licence.

This premise had its licence revoked by the licensing committee on 05/06/14 after a review had been submitted by Weights and Measures. This application was supported by the Police following on from a failed test purchase at the premises.

The premises requires a strong DPS in day to day control of the business and who knows the area and local community as this would be a high risk premises and as it currently stands the applicant has another business that he currently runs in Southport so I am unsure what percentage of his time would be spent at these premises. Since the applicant put in his last application I have met with him and discussed the business and although he seems to be a good operator and has put forward some very good conditions **I am disappointed that he had not contacted the Police before making such a large purchase and a new business venture or investigating the background of the premises beforehand then I could have advised him of the issues. With that in mind the area is still within an area of High Deprivation, alcohol dependency and high levels of anti-social behaviour and I have to look at how another premises would impact on the areas quality of life.**

Concerns have also been raised by the Local Community Beat Manager for the area, statement attached.

A hearing would allow the Licensing Committee to examine the prospective operators' intentions and rebut the presumption that the operation of the premises will not add to the cumulative impact and therefore crime and disorder.

I am TPS 133 HARPER of Lancashire Constabulary currently based at Blackpool South Police Station.

I am currently the neighbourhood policing sergeant for the Bloomfield area of Blackpool, prior to this I was the Community Beat Manager for the same area and I held the post since January 2008. I make this statement in relation to Bolton St News, Bolton St, Blackpool making an application to sell alcohol; this is an application I would object to.

As with my previous objection I will begin by giving a brief overview of the Bloomfield area, specifically between Lytham Rd and the Promenade which includes Bolton St and is an extremely deprived part of the country. Blackpool itself is split down into 21 wards and recent data shows that the Bloomfield ward accounted for 15% of all Violent Crime and 11% of Criminal Damage which are the second highest levels out of the 21 wards. Anti Social Behaviour also places Bloomfield third out of the 21 wards taking on 12%. Bloomfield has a severe level of deprivation, within the worst 1.0% deprived wards in England.

The following is an extract from my previous statement

"The area of Bolton St, Waterloo Rd and Lytham Rd suffer from a high amount of alcohol fuelled crime and disorder and anti-social behaviour. This can be at all times of the year and is

often led by the local people who live here. There are a high number of alcoholics on the area who rely on buying cheap alcohol and Bolton St news is an establishment which they frequent. This leads to drinking on the street which leads to the local businesses in the area complaining to police and it becomes a very time resourceful issue for the neighbourhood policing team. There have also been past issues with underage drinking on Bolton St and the surrounding areas and kids either attempting to get served or hanging around outside the off licence waiting for someone else to buy alcohol for them"

The NHP team oppose this application as there are still licenced premises in the area and it is unnecessary to give the local people so many opportunities to buy drink which leads to a vast amount of problems. Since Bolton St News last had its licence rejected there have not been anywhere near as many problems. Drinking in public on Bolton St has been reduced and this goes hand in hand with a reduction in ASB. I would like to keep things the way they are now for Bolton St as the police and Blackpool Council are putting in a lot of effort to improve the area.

I will also add that there are many houses of multi occupancy in that area and one directly opposite Bolton St News which is housed with problematic people with substance misuse issues therefore having easy access to alcohol sales will not prove helpful.

The Public Health Department, Blackpool Council, write in reference to the new Premises Licence application for Bolton News, Blackpool.

The applicant brings this application in full knowledge that this store is located within Bloomfield ward which has been subject to the Cumulative Impact Policy (CIP) since 2009.

Issues in Bloomfield ward

This premise is in an area which already has a high number of off-license premises, in an area of high deprivation, high levels of street drinking and alcohol dependency.

- In total Bloomfield ward has approx. 23 other premises where off sale alcohol can be purchased and there are also a total of approx.337 establishments where alcohol can be consumed on the premises within the ward.
- Every year in Bloomfield there are approximately 400 hospital admissions for alcohol attributable harm. This is an admission ratio of 224, significantly higher than for Blackpool as a whole (137) and the England average (100). The ratio of hospital admissions for alcohol related harm between England and Bloomfield is 1 : 2.2.
- The premise is also in an area which has a 'calls to police rate' of 1378.2 per thousand as compared to the Blackpool average of 573.8 per thousand and a Lancashire average of 366.1 per thousand, many of which are aggravated by either the perpetrator or victim being drunk (Safer Lancashire Statistics, 2015-2016).

Public Health would ask the Licensing Committee to consider the potential risks associated with the increase in the availability of alcohol within this Saturation Area in their deliberations as to whether to grant this application.
