APPLICATION FOR A PREMISES LICENCE - Food Plus @ Polon

1.0 Purpose of the report:

1.1 To consider an application for a new Premises Licence for Food Plus @ Polon, 47-53 Abingdon Street, Blackpool, FY1 1DH.

6.0 Background information

On 1 June 2021 the Licensing Service received an application from JMC Licensing on behalf of Mr Radoslaw Barwinski for a new Premises Licence at Food Plus @ Polon, 47-53

Abingdon Street, Blackpool, FY1 1DH. The property has never held a Premises Licence and

previously traded as a Bright House store.

- 6.2 The application requests permission to sell alcohol for consumption off the premises 08.00 20.00 Monday to Sunday with opening hours from 08:00 to 22:00 Monday to Sunday. A copy of the application is attached.
- 6.3 Representations have been received from the Licensing Authority, Lancashire Constabulary, the Child Protection Licensing Officer and Public Health. Copies of the representations are attached.
- 6.4 Local policy considerations:

The premises falls within the area covered by the Off Licence Cumulative Impact Assessment (CIA). The following sections of the policy are relevant:

- 4.9.1 The location of the main concentration of off-licensed premises suffers from high levels of alcohol related crime and alcohol related hospital admissions. Applications for new licences, or variation of hours within this area will be refused unless the applicant can demonstrate that their application will not lead to an increase in the impact of off licensed premises in this area.
- 4.10.1 Applications for new licences or variations to existing licences within a cumulative impact area, which are likely to add to the existing cumulative impact, will normally be refused if a relevant representation is received. To persuade the Council to depart from its policy an applicant must demonstrate that their application will not add to the existing cumulative impact in the area. This should be done through the operating schedule and the risk assessment process (if used).
- 4.10.4 Examples of factors the licensing authority will not consider to rebut the presumption of refusal:
 - The premises will be well managed and run as all licensed premises should meet this standard
 - The premises will be constructed to a high standard
 - The applicant operates similar premises elsewhere without complaint.
- 4.10.6 Where representations are received the Council will consider the circumstances of each individual application and decide whether it would be justified in departing from its policy and CIA in the light of the individual circumstances of the case.
- 6.5 National policy considerations:
 - 9.12 Each responsible authority will be an expert in their respective field, and in some cases it is likely that a particular responsible authority will be the licensing authority's main source of advice in relation to a particular licensing objective... any responsible authority

under the 2003 Act may make representations with regard to any of the licensing objectives if they have evidence to support such representations. Licensing authorities must therefore consider all relevant representations from responsible authorities carefully... However, it remains incumbent on all responsible authorities to ensure that their representations can withstand the scrutiny to which they would be subject at a hearing.

9.43 – The authority's decision should be evidence-based, justified as being appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives and proportionate to what it is intended to achieve.

14.44 – After receiving relevant representations in relation to a new application for... a licence or certificate, the licensing authority must consider whether it would be justified in departing from its CIA in the light of the individual circumstances of the case... If the licensing authority decides that an application should be refused, it will still need to show that the grant of the application would undermine the promotion of one or more of the licensing objectives and that appropriate conditions would be ineffective in preventing the problems involved.

1: CCTV

of

1.1 The premise shall operate an effective CCTV system that will be maintained

in good working order to the satisfaction of the Lancashire Constabulary. The CCTV system shall cover all areas of the store including the entrance, point

sale and main alcohol displays.

1.2 Signage warning customers of The CCTV system shall be prominently displayed . on the premises. The system will record whenever the premises is open for

licensable activities.

- **1.3** The CCTV system shall be capable of obtaining clear facial recognition images and a clear head and shoulders image of every person entering the premises and at the point of sale.
- **1.4** The location of cameras (to include the stock area) will be recorded on the plan attached to the licence. If any additional cameras are requested/advised by the police, they will be fitted within a reasonable time.
- **1.5** The recording medium (e.g. discs / tapes / hard drive etc.) and associated images are to be retained and securely stored for a minimum period of 31 days and are to be made available to the Police Constable / Authorised Officer of the Licensing Authority upon request within a reasonable time.
- **1.6** The Premises Licence Holder or Designated Premises Supervisor will provide the Police with the contact details of at least two members of staff (if any or other person(s) who are trained and familiar with the operation of the equipment so that they are able to provide copies of recorded data upon request and with the absolute minimum delay from the time of the request.
- 1.7 A full internal weekly check of the CCTV system will be made on a log sheet

to ensure that the CCTV system is in good working order and recordings date and time stamped.

- **1.8** The Premises Licence holder / Designated Premises Supervisor must ensure that steps are taken to rectify any fault in the CCTV system immediately and a log of these steps are made available for inspection to a Police Constable or an authorised officer from the Licensing Authority.
- **1.9** When the DPS is not on duty, there will be another authorised person who will be contactable at all times and be able to attend the premises within one hour while the supply and sale of alcohol is being undertaken (whose identity will be known to all other staff engaged in the supply or sale of alcohol) except in cases of emergency

b) The prevention of crime and disorder

As above plus

- **2.1** Roller shutters have been installed at the front of the premises on the inside of all windows.
- **2.2** A 2.4 metre high iron security gate has been fitted to the external rear security doors.
- **2.3** All alcoholic products including spirits will only be displayed and sold from behind the counter; inaccessible to the customers.
- **2.4** No beers or ciders with an ABV of 7.0% or above will be stored or sold from the premises. Signage notifying customers will be displayed at the entrance to the premises and at the point of sale.
- **2.5** No single cans of beer, lager or cider will be sold from the premise. Signage notifying customers of this will be displayed at the entrance to the premises.
- **2.6** The premises will not store or sell any psychoactive substances known as 'legal highs', store or sell fireworks and knives off any size or description.
- **2.7** The names and contact details of all persons who has been authorised to sell

alcohol whether paid or unpaid shall be maintained and kept on the premises. This document will be found at the front of the Training manual and shall be produced to a Police Constable or an Officer of the Local Authority upon demand.

- **2.8** The Designated Premises Supervisor and all members of staff when on duty shall ensure that all lawful instructions and /or directions given by the Police are complied with.
- **2.9** Any customer who appears to be carrying an alcoholic drink in an open vessel will be refused service and be asked to leave.
- **2.10** Signage to inform customers will be in place near the point of sale and exits warning customers of the Public Space Protection Order.
- **2.11** No credit will be given for the sale of alcohol
- **2.12** There shall be a minimum purchase for the value of £5.00 of non alcoholic products (not including cigarettes) before any alcoholic products can be purchased.

INCIDENT LOG

2.13 The premises shall maintain an incident book to record details of the Following:-

- Any violence or anti-social behavior on or immediately outside the premises,
- Any other crime or criminal activity on the premises,
- Any call for police/ambulance assistance to the premises,
- **2.14** The log records shall be made immediately available on request to a Police Constable or an Officer authorized by the Licensing Authority (as defined by section 13 of the Licensing Act 2003) All records shall be retained on the premises for 12 months from the date of the incident.
- **2.15** Any staff employed at the premises shall be provided with training before they sell alcohol and refresher training every 6 months thereafter. Training will include information on preventing the sale of alcohol to somebody who is drunk and Age Restricted Products.
- **2.16** A written record will be kept of all training carried out. These records will be stored on the premises and made available for inspection to a Police Constable or an Officer authorized by the Licensing Authority within a reasonable time.

d) The prevention of public nuisance

- **4.1** Prominent, clear and legible signage shall be displayed at the exits to the premises requesting the public to respect the needs of local residents, businesses and to leave the premises and the area quickly and quietly.
- **4.2** The Premises Licence holder / Designated Premises Supervisor will ensure that litter arising from people using the premises is cleared away on a regular basis.
- **4.3** The Premises Licence Holder will fix a waste bin outside the premises and empty this daily.
- **4.4** The Premises Licence Holder will ensure that no lighting or air conditioning units will cause any nuisance to another neighbouring property.
- **4.5** All trade waste will be stored in a commercial lidded waste container at the rear of the premises and removed under contract by a registered waste collector.

- **5.1** The premises will operate a "Challenge 25" proof of age policy which will require any person who appears to be under the age of 25 to produce identification to prove they are 18 or over.
- **5.2** Only a passport, photo-card driving licence, European Union ID, Armed Forces ID cards or a proof of age card bearing the official "PASS" accreditation hologram, a photograph of the individual and date of birth shall be accepted as proof of age.
- **5.3** Prominent, clear and legible Challenge 25 signage shall also be displayed at all entrances to the premises as well as at, at least one location behind any counter advertising the scheme operated.
- **5.4** The premises is to maintain a refusals log book to record the details of all refusals of the sale of alcohol to persons suspected of being under the age of 18, appear to be drunk or suspected proxy sales.

Training will include information on how to prevent underage sales, acceptable forms of ID, basic conflict management and Age Restricted Products.

- **5.8** No person under the age of 18 will be employed to work at the premises.
- **5.9** Alcohol refusals policies will be displayed at the entrance of the premises, the point of display and the point of sale.
- **5.10** Proxy notices will be prominently displayed at all places where alcoholis displayed and sold from and at the point of sale.



I am the above named person and I make these representations on behalf of the Licensing Authority in my capacity as Trading Standards and Licensing Manager. I am in receipt of a copy of the application for a premises Licence in respect of the premises referred to above.

The application is for the supply of alcohol off the premises between 8am – 8pm Mon – Sun. The applicant has indicated that the intention is to operate these premises as a European super market. Following a conversation with Mr Clarke of JMC Licensing, I am led to believe that the operation of the store will be similar to that of a Sainsbury's/Tesco local.

Having perused the substantial conditions offered in support of the application it is clear that the applicants have considered the Licensing objectives to a significant degree. However, due to the location of the proposed premises, which is in an area of "cumulative impact" the question for the Authority is whether the application will not lead to an increase in the impact of off-licensed premises in this area. The location of the premises is approximately 100 metres from The Co-Op store, which is Licensed for off sales, it is also approximately 25 metres from News & Booze, again licensed for off sales and approximately 50 metres from Home Bargains, also Licensed for off sales.

Policy Considerations

Paragraph 4.9.1 of the Blackpool Statement of Licence Policy 2021 and appendix C of the same, disclose the areas of Blackpool where it is considered the cumulative impact of off-licence premises

exists. The location of these premises is situated in Talbot ward. The whole of Talbot ward is included in the cumulative impact area.

Talbot Ward is an area of Blackpool that is saturated with Licensed premises. The Blackpool Cumulative Impact Assessment 2021 indicates at page 4 of the document that Talbot ward is home to the largest concentration of off licence premises in the town. Twenty three off licence premises exist in this area which is 12.8% of all off licence premises in Blackpool.

Pages 8 and 9 of the Blackpool Cumulative Impact Assessment 2021 demonstrates that Talbot ward is statistically one of the worst affected hospital admissions data. Figures A & B of the CIA document also show the geographical location of off licence premises in the respective ward areas. Upon visual analysis of these illustrations it is easy to see the link between high volumes of off licence premises and higher levels of alcohol related incidents.






To conclude, the location of the proposed new premises licence automatically invokes consideration of the Council's CIA document and Statement of Licensing Policy. This in turn creates a rebuttable presumption that the application should be refused unless it can be established to the satisfaction of the Authority that the granting of this Licence will not add to the cumulative impact already being experienced in this area.

Reasons for making representations

I am in receipt of an application for a New Premises Licence for the above address. On behalf of the Chief Officer of Police having reviewed the application the Police wish to make a formal objection on the following grounds.

The Police base the objection on the fact that the new premises is within the Off Licence Cumulative Impact Assessment Area. The purpose of this Policy is to create a rebuttable presumption that any applications such as the above will be refused a licence.

The number, type and density of the premises selling alcohol in a particular area can lead to serious problems of nuisance and disorder. In these circumstances the impact of the premises taken as a whole can be far greater than that arising from individual premises. In most cases it would be impossible to identify an individual premise as being the sole cause or major contributing factor.

It is noted that Blackpool has high levels of alcohol related harm for the size of the population and has widespread deprivation within the Central Wards of the town. There are already approximately 179 licensed premises in Blackpool, half of which are located in the most deprived wards in the town.

In 2019 Lancashire Police recorded 12,001 alcohol related incidents and the highest suffering area was Blackpool with 2,511 with the next highest being Preston at 1,444. Of these incidents the two most affected wards are Claremont and Talbot.

This premises falls within Talbot Ward close to the border with Claremont Ward and is a large premises (previously Bright House). Within a two minutes stroll from here is News & Booze, Co-op, Iceland, Home Bargains, Booze Buster and Marks & Spencers. The availability of alcohol in this immediate area is already excessive.

According to Police logs in the last year (between 25/06/2020 – 25/06/2021) there have been 229 recorded incidents on Abingdon Street alone. The highest incident location on Abingdon Street during this time was the Co-op. These incidents included theft, nuisance, police generated, harassment, assault and concern for safety. Many of these incidents relate to individuals that suffer from alcohol and drug abuse. Abingdon Street also has regular rough sleepers and street drinkers that have become verbally abusive to the public on many occasions. The Police concern is that by allowing another off-licence in this area alcohol is even more available and this would further exasperate the problems already being experienced in this area.

It can be noted that the applicants solicitor did make contact with the Police prior to submitting this application in order to get recommendations to reduce any impacts on the licensing objectives, however the Police are of the opinion that this premises would add to the cumulative impact already being experienced in the area.

A hearing would allow the Licensing Committee to examine the prospective operators' intentions and rebut the presumption that the operation of the premises will add to the cumulative impact and therefore crime and disorder.

Reasons for making representations

The Public Health Department, Blackpool Council, write in reference to the application for a licence to sell alcohol from Food Plus @ Polon in Talbot ward.

Talbot Ward has been subject to the Cumulative Impact Policy (CIP) since 2009.

As stated in Blackpool Council's Statement of Licensing Policy –

The effect of the policy is to create a rebuttable presumption that applications listed above will be refused. To rebut this presumption, an applicant would be expected to show through the operating schedule, and where appropriate, with supporting evidence, that the operation of the premises will not add to the cumulative impact already being experienced.

Following review of this application, Public Health, Blackpool Council, make a formal objection due to the following concerns:

Deprivation

• Blackpool is ranked amongst the most deprived areas in the country. Talbot Ward is the third

most deprived ward in Blackpool.

 There is a statistical correlation between Blackpool's areas of deprivation and hotspots for violent crime, domestic abuse, and criminal damage, all associated with alcohol abuse to some degree.

Health related information

- Health statistics show Talbot ward to have amongst the highest ratio of alcohol-related hospital admissions in Blackpool.
- The alcohol-related admission rate of 279.9 per 100,000 is almost 200% higher than the national average Blackpool as a whole is 83% higher than the national average.
- Ambulance callout rates for overdose, ingestion and poisoning are three times higher than
 the Blackpool average of 10.3 and almost eight times higher than the Lancashire average of
 3.6.
- There were 44 assault-related attendances at A&E in 2018/19 from people living in Talbot. This is an attendance rate of 6.9 per 1,000 population, 1.5 times higher than the Blackpool average (4.3) and 2.5 times higher than the Lancashire average (2.7).
- Talbot has the third highest rate of assault-related A&E attendances in Blackpool, where rates range from 1.6 in Bispham to 11.2 in Bloomfield.
- There were 347 police-recorded domestic abuse incidents in Talbot in 2019/20. Talbot has
 the second highest recorded crime rate for domestic abuse in Blackpool, a rate of 54.5 per
 1,000 population compared to a Blackpool average of 24.1 per 1,000 and a Lancashire
 average of 11.5 per 1,000.


Alcohol reported incidents


- In 2019/20, 428 of Talbot's police-recorded incidents had an alcohol qualifier i.e. incidents where the consumption and effects of alcohol are more than merely incidental.
- There were 418 notifiable crimes in Talbot in 2019/20 where alcohol consumption was an aggravating factor.
- Talbot has the second highest rate of alcohol related crime in Blackpool.
- The rate of alcohol related crime in Talbot is 65.7 per 1,000 population, over three times higher than the Blackpool average of 18.0 and ten times higher than the Lancashire average of 6.4.
- There were 418 notifiable crimes in Talbot in 2019/20 where alcohol consumption was an aggravating factor.

Concerns regarding the application:

Public Health justifiably has concerns that if an alcohol license is granted to these premises, it would increase the availability of alcohol in an area which is already experiencing significant levels of alcohol-related harm. This premise is situated in a ward that has one of the highest number of off-licence premises in the whole of Blackpool. There are 19 off-licence premises in Talbot ward (data as at May 2020). The maps below demonstrate the cluster of alcohol premises in Talbot ward and the

surrounding areas in relation to the rate of alcohol-related hospital admissions and alcohol-related crime. We can find no evidence that a minimum £5 spend will have any impact on the concerns set out in this objection, and there is no evidence on what would be achieved.





Public Health has concerns that this premises is situated in an area where there are also a large number of premises that sell alcohol within close proximity.

Public Health believes that the applicant has not taken the wider challenging factors of the area into consideration within their application. Public Health is aware of the problem of street drinking within the locality in which this premise is located. These problems have a negative impact on public safety and the health and wellbeing of the local community. The sale of low value/high alcohol products and the potential negative impact of increasing alcohol availability within this locality are not taken into consideration.

Public Health would ask the Licensing Committee to consider the potential risks associated with the increase in the availability of alcohol within this Saturation Area in their deliberations as to whether to grant this application. It is difficult to see how the granting of this application would not add to the cumulative impact already experienced in this area.

I am concerned that based on the application the applicant has not given consideration as to how the operation would not add to existing problems in the area.

I would recommend that this application is refused.
