APPLICATION FOR A VARIATION TO A PREMISES LICENCE – Tesco Express, 96-98 Whitegate Drive, Blackpool, FY3 9BZ

1.0 Purpose of the report:

1.1 To consider an application for a Variation to the Licence for Tesco Express, 96-98 Whitegate Drive, Blackpool, FY3 9BZ

2.0 Recommendation(s):

2.1 The Panel is requested to consider the application and determine whether the granting of this variation to the licence would adversely impact on the Licensing Objectives.

3.0 Reasons for recommendation(s):

- 3.1 Representations have been received therefore there must be a hearing to determine the application.
- 3.2 Is the recommendation contrary to a plan or strategy adopted or approved by the Council?
- 3.3 Is the recommendation in accordance with the Council's approved budget? Yes

4.0 Other alternative options to be considered:

4.1 None, once an application is submitted and representations received it must be considered by the Licensing Panel.

5.0 Council priority:

- 5.1 The relevant Council priority is
 - "The economy: Maximising growth and opportunity across Blackpool"

6.0 Background information

- On 5th April 2023 the Licensing Service received a Variation application from Tesco Stores Limited for a Variation to the Premises Licence at Tesco Express, 96-98 Whitegate Drive, Blackpool, FY3 9BZ. The licence currently allows off sale of alcohol, weekdays (other than Christmas Day) 08.00 23.00, Sundays (other than Christmas Day) 10.00 22.30, Christmas Day 12.00 15.00 and 19.00 22.30, Good Friday 08.00 23.00.
- The application requests permission to sell alcohol for consumption off the premises Monday to Sunday 06.00 00.00, the provision of late night refreshment Monday to Sunday 23.00 00.00, to remove the embedded/seasonal restrictions for Good Friday and Christmas Day carried over from the old Licensing Act and to update the layout plan attached to the premise licence. The applicant has also volunteered a number of conditions on the application form which will be attached to the Premises Licence if granted, a copy of the application is attached at Appendix 4(a).
- 6.3 A Representation has been received from Lee Petrak Licensing Manager. A copy of the representation is attached at Appendix 4(b).
- 6.4 Local policy considerations:

The premises falls within the area covered by the Off Licence Cumulative Impact Assessment (CIA). The following sections of the policy are relevant:

- 4.9.1 The location of the main concentration of off-licensed premises suffers from high levels of alcohol related crime and alcohol related hospital admissions. Applications for new licences, or variation of hours within this area will be refused unless the applicant can demonstrate that their application will not lead to an increase in the impact of off licensed premises in this area.
- 4.10.1 Applications for new licences or variations to existing licences within a cumulative impact area, which are likely to add to the existing cumulative impact, will normally be refused if a relevant representation is received. To persuade the Council to depart from its policy an applicant must demonstrate that their application will not add to the existing cumulative impact in the area. This should be done through the operating schedule and the risk assessment process (if used).
- 4.10.4 Examples of factors the licensing authority will not consider to rebut the presumption of refusal:
 - The premises will be well managed and run as all licensed premises should meet this standard
 - The premises will be constructed to a high standard
 - The applicant operates similar premises elsewhere without complaint.

4.10.6 Where representations are received the Council will consider the circumstances of each individual application and decide whether it would be justified in departing from its policy and CIA in the light of the individual circumstances of the case.

6.5 National policy considerations:

9.12 – Each responsible authority will be an expert in their respective field, and in some cases it is likely that a particular responsible authority will be the licensing authority's main source of advice in relation to a particular licensing objective any responsible authority under the 2003 Act may make representations with regard to any of the licensing objectives if they have evidence to support such representations. Licensing authorities must therefore consider all relevant representations from responsible authorities carefully. However, it remains incumbent on all responsible authorities to ensure that their representations can withstand the scrutiny to which they would be subject at a hearing.

9.43 – The authority's decision should be evidence-based, justified as being appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives and proportionate to what it is intended to achieve.

14.44 – After receiving relevant representations in relation to a new application for a licence or certificate, the licensing authority must consider whether it would be justified in departing from its CIA in the light of the individual circumstances of the case. If the licensing authority decides that an application should be refused, it will still need to show that the grant of the application would undermine the promotion of one or more of the licensing objectives and that appropriate conditions would be ineffective in preventing the problems involved.

a) General - all four licensing objectives (b, c, d, and e) (please read guidance note 11)

Tesco is a large national operator with a range of head office and local support. The company has devised policies, procedures, systems, and training to ensure that they sell alcohol in a responsible manner.

There is a detailed programme which ensures that comprehensive training is provided to employees having regard to their role and the responsibilities and such training is regularly reviewed, and records kept.

b) The prevention of crime and disorder

We will have a digital CCTV system that covers the premises, including the main area which will be used for display of alcohol. Images will be retained for 31 days.

A member of the management team will be on the premises all the time the store is open. This colleague will have responsibility for the premises and will be the initial point of contact for any issues that may arise.

c) Public safety

The premises licence holder is fully aware of its responsibilities under a range of health and safety related legislation and has policies and procedures in place to be confident of complying with the relevant obligations which arise.

d) The prevention of public nuisance

The company has a "good neighbour" ethos which seeks to ensure that the premises plays an active part in the local community.

e) The protection of children from harm

The premises will operate a Think 25 policy. The checkouts will be programmed to prompt the customer assistant when an alcohol product is scanned at the checkout to follow the Think 25 policy.

All colleagues will receive training in relation to the underlying law and Tesco policy, systems, and procedures. This training will be documented, and refresher training will be provided on a regular basis.



Notes for Guidance

This application cannot be used to vary the licence so as to extend the period for which the licence has effect or to vary substantially the premises to which it relates. If you wish to make that type of change to the premises licence, you should make a new premises licence application under section 17 of the Licensing Act 2003.

- 1. You do not have to pay a fee if the only purpose of the variation for which you are applying is to avoid becoming liable for the late-night levy
- 2. Describe the premises. For example, the type of premises, its general situation and layout and any other information which could be relevant to the licensing objectives.  - Boxing or Wrestling Entertainment: no licence is required for a contest, exhibition or display of Greco-Roman wrestling, or freestyle wrestling between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 1000. Combined fighting sports defined as a contest, exhibition or display which combines boxing or wrestling with one or more martial arts are licensable as a boxing or wrestling entertainment rather than an indoor sporting event.
 - Live music: no licence permission is required for:
 - a performance of unamplified live music between 08,00 and 23.00 on any day, on any premises.
 - a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day on premises authorised to sell alcohol for consumption on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
 - o a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a workplace that is not licensed to sell alcohol on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
 - o a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a church hall, village hall, community hall, or other similar community premises, that is not licensed by a premises licence to sell alcohol, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance from a person who is responsible for the premises.
 - o a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, at the non-residential premises of (i) a local authority, or (ii) a school, or (iii) a hospital, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance on the relevant premises from: (i) the local authority concerned, or (ii) the school or (iii) the health care provider for the hospital.
 - Recorded Music: no licence permission is required for:
 - any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day on premises authorised to sell alcohol for consumption on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
 - o any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a church hall, village hall, community hall, or other similar community

- premises, that is not licensed by a premises licence to sell alcohol, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance from a person who is responsible for the premises.
- o any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, at the non-residential premises of (i) a local authority, or (ii) a school, or (iii) a hospital, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance on the relevant premises from: (i) the local authority concerned, or (ii) the school proprietor or (iii) the health care provider for the hospital.
- Dance: no licence is required for performances between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 500. However, a performance which amounts to adult entertainment remains licensable.
- Cross activity exemptions: no licence is required between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, with no limit on audience size for:
 - any entertainment taking place on the premises of the local authority where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the local authority;
 - any entertainment taking place on the hospital premises of the health care provider where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the health care provider;
 - any entertainment taking place on the premises of the school where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the school proprietor; and

I am the above named person and I make these representations on behalf of the Licensing Authority in my capacity as Trading Standards and Licensing Manager. I am in receipt of a copy of the application to vary the premises Licence in respect of the premises referred to above.

The application is to vary the existing licence hours when the supply of alcohol may take place for consumption off the premises. At present the licence hours are 0800–2300 Monday to Saturday and 10.00-22.30 on Sundays. It is being proposed through the application that the hours off sales may take place be increased to 06.00-23.00 Monday to Sunday. It is also proposed that late night refreshments be permitted between 23.00-00.00 Monday to Sunday to bring this provision in line with the later opening hours. A new plan is also part of the application as is the request to remove seasonal restrictions.

The location of the premises and the proposed changes to operating hours require the application be determined with consideration of the Council's current statement of licensing policy and cumulative impact assessment.

It is perhaps noteworthy that a similar such application was determined by the committee approximately 12 months ago in connection with a similar store in close proximity of the applicants store. On that occasion, with a substantial submission by the applicant and with prior consultation with the Licensing Authority and Police Licensing Team, the applicant in that case successfully varied their licensable hours from 08.00-23.00 Monday - Sunday to 07.00-00.00 Monday - Sunday. No such

Section 4.9 of the Council Statement of Licensing Policy details the application of the Council Cumulative Impact Assessment in respect of off licence premises.
