6.0 Background information

- On 19 July 2023 the Licensing Service received an application from Rodger Wightman of The Licensing Practice on behalf of Mohammed Anwar for a new Premises Licence at 8 Newton Drive, Blackpool, FY3 8BS.

 The premises has never been licensed before.
- The application requests permission to sell alcohol for consumption off the premises 07.00 to 23.00 Monday to Sunday with opening hours also from 07:00 to 23:00 Monday to Sunday. The applicant has volunteered a number of conditions on the application form which will be attached to the Premises Licence if granted, a copy of the application is attached at Appendix 4(a).
- Representations have been received from Mark Marshall of M Squared on behalf of Mr Subaramaniam Gopinath who is the Premise Licence Holder at Wine Lodge, 3 Whitegate Drive, Blackpool, FY3 9AE. A copy of the representation is attached at Appendix 4b.
- 6.4 Local policy considerations:
 - 4.1.7 If relevant representations are made the Council will only grant the hours of use proposed where the operating schedule and any risk assessments adequately demonstrate that:
 - The applicant has properly considered what is appropriate for the local area when considering what hours and activities to apply for
 - The potential effect on the licensing objectives is not significant
 - The operating schedule demonstrates that the applicant is taking appropriate steps to minimise any adverse impact on local residents and businesses
 - 4.4.2 The Council wishes to develop a diverse night-time economy but acknowledges that any licensable activity has the potential to impact adversely on the surrounding area either by disturbance caused by crime and disorder or by nuisance caused by customers being noisy when leaving/using on-street car parking. The impact of these activities can be greater at night when ambient noise levels are much lower.

6.5 National policy considerations:

2.15 - The 2003 Act enables licensing authorities and responsible authorities, through representations, to consider what constitutes public nuisance and what is appropriate to prevent it in terms of conditions attached to specific premises licences and club premises certificates. It is therefore important that in considering the promotion of this licensing objective, licensing authorities and responsible authorities focus on the effect of the licensable activities at the specific premises on persons living and working (including those carrying on business) in the area around the premises which may be disproportionate and unreasonable. The issues will mainly concern noise nuisance, light pollution, noxious smells and litter.

8.44 - It is expected that enquiries about the locality will assist applicants when determining the steps that are appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives. For example, premises with close proximity to residential premises should consider what effect this will have on their smoking, noise management and dispersal policies to ensure the promotion of the public nuisance objective. Applicants must consider all factors which may be relevant to the promotion of the licensing objectives, and where there are no known concerns, acknowledge this in their application.

9.43 – The authority's decision should be evidence-based, justified as being appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives and proportionate to what it is intended to achieve.

b) The prevention of crime and disorder

CCTV shall be installed internally and externally at the premises and shall-comply with the following;

- a. The CCTV system shall be installed, maintained and operated to the reasonable satisfaction of Lancashire Constabulary. All public areas of the premises are to be covered by the system. The system shall incorporate a camera covering each of the entrance doors and shall be capable of providing an image which is regarded as identification standard.
- b. The system shall display on any recording the correct time and date of the recording.
- c. The system shall make recordings during all hours the premises are open to the public.
- d. VCR tapes or digital recording shall be held for a minimum of 31 days and 28 days respectively, after the recording is made and shall be made available to the Police or any authorised persons acting for a Responsible Authority for inspection upon request.
- e. The system will, as a minimum, record images of the head and shoulders of all persons entering the premises.

A staff member who is conversant with the operation of the CCTV system shall be on the premises at all times the premises are open to the public. This staff member shall be able to show recent data or footage with the absolute minimum of delay when requested to a Police Officer or to a Local Authority Enforcement Officer.

Appropriate signage alerting customers to CCTV recording shall be displayed in conspicuous positions on the premises.

An incident book will be maintained within which full details of all occurrences of disorder and refused alcohol sales at the premises will be recorded. This incident book will be kept on the premises at all times and be readily available for inspection by the Police.

A refusals register (whether kept and written or electronic form) will be maintained.

No customers will be permitted to take open containers of alcoholic drinks from the premises.

Whenever the Designated Premises Supervisor is not at the premises another person shall be nominated by them to be the responsible person to manage the premises.

An authorisation of sales, signed and dated by the Designated Premises Supervisor, shall be kept at the premises showing all persons authorised by them to make sales of alcohol at the premises.

At least one Personal Licence holder shall be available (this does not mean necessarily present at the premises) at all times that alcohol is on sale.

c) Public safety

The Premises Licence Holder shall operate in accordance with all relevant legislation which promotes the public safety objective including, but not limited to, the Health and Safety at Work etc Act 1974 and associate regulations, the Food Safety Act 1990, the Regulatory Reform (Fire Safety) Order 2005 and the Disability Discrimination Act 1995.

Adequate first aid provision shall be available at all times.

d) The prevention of public nuisance

Outside the premises, collecting and disposing of litter will be maintained regularly.

A clear, legible and conspicuous notice requesting patrons to avoid causing noise, nuisance or disturbance to local residents and to leave the area quickly and quietly shall be displayed at every exit.

e) The protection of children from harm

A Challenge 25 proof of age policy shall be implemented and adhered to. All staff to have received suitable training in relation to the Challenge 25 proof of age scheme. Records to evidence this will be made available to an authorised officer upon request.

Any person who looks or appears to be under the age of 25 shall be asked to provide identification that they are over the age of 18. The following are the only forms of identification acceptable:

- i. A recognised proof of age card accredited under the British Retail Consortium's Proof of Age Standards Scheme (PASS)
- ii. Photo driving licence
- iii. Citizen card supported by the Home Office
- iv. Official ID card issued by HM Forces or European Union bearing a photograph and date of birth of the holder.

If no suitable identification is provided, the sale of alcohol to them will be refused.

All staff who are involved in the sale of alcohol shall be trained in relation to the Challenge 25 policy upon commencement of their employment following which refresher training will take place at a minimum of every 6 months. Records to evidence this will be made available to an authorised officer upon request.

Suitable signage will be displayed to specify that a Challenge 25 Policy is in place and that it is an offence to buy alcohol for persons under 18.

 contest, exhibition or display of Greco-Roman wrestling, or freestyle
 wrestling between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the
 audience does not exceed 1000. Combined fighting sports defined
 as a contest, exhibition or display which combines boxing or wrestling
 with one or more martial arts are licensable as a boxing or wrestling
 entertainment rather than an indoor sporting event.
 - Live music: no licence permission is required for:
 - a performance of unamplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, on any premises.
 - a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day on premises authorised to sell alcohol for consumption on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
 - a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a workplace that is not licensed to sell alcohol on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
 - a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a church hall, village hall, community hall, or other similar community premises, that is not licensed by a premises licence to sell alcohol, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance from a person who is responsible for the premises.
 - o a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, at the non-residential premises of (i) a local authority, or (ii) a school, or (iii) a hospital, provided that (a) the

audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance on the relevant premises from: (i) the local authority concerned, or (ii) the school or (iii) the health care provider for the hospital.

- Recorded Music: no licence permission is required for:
 - any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day on premises authorised to sell alcohol for consumption on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
 - any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a church hall, village hall, community hall, or other similar community premises, that is not licensed by a premises licence to sell alcohol, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance from a person who is responsible for the premises.
 - o any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, at the non-residential premises of (i) a local authority, or (ii) a school, or (iii) a hospital, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance on the relevant premises from: (i) the local authority concerned, or (ii) the school proprietor or (iii) the health care provider for the hospital.
- Dance: no licence is required for performances between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 500. However, a performance which amounts to adult entertainment remains licensable.
- Cross activity exemptions: no licence is required between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, with no limit on audience size for:
 - any entertainment taking place on the premises of the local authority where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the local authority;
 - any entertainment taking place on the hospital premises of the health care provider where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the health care provider;
 - any entertainment taking place on the premises of the school where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the school proprietor; and
 - o any entertainment (excluding films and a boxing or wrestling entertainment) taking place at a travelling circus, provided that (a) it takes place within a moveable structure that accommodates the audience, and (b) that the travelling circus has not been located on the same site for more than 28 consecutive days.

- 10. Please list here steps you will take to promote all four licensing objectives together.
- 11. The application form must be signed.
- 12. An applicant's agent (for example solicitor) may sign the form on their behalf provided that they have actual authority to do so.
- 13. Where there is more than one applicant, each of the applicants or their respective agent must sign the application form.
- 14. This is the address which we shall use to correspond with you about this application.
- 15. Entitlement to work/immigration status for individual applicants and applications from partnerships which are not limited liability partnerships;

A licence may not be issued to an individual or an individual in a partnership which is not a limited liability partnership who is resident in the UK who:

- · does not have the right to live and work in the UK; or
- is subject to a condition preventing him or her from doing work relating to the carrying on of a licensable activity.



Representation Against New Premises Licence

Activities - Sale of Alcohol by Retail

I am concerned about the impact of the Prevention of Crime and Disorder and the Prevention of Public Nuisance Objective being undermined. The primary basis of the concern comes from the location of the premises, and the issues already occurring in the area. and the added stress that new premises will have on the cumulative impact already being experienced.

I have operated on the premises (3 Whitegate Drive) for 20 years as well as residing in the accommodation above the shop and in that time, I have come to understand the community I serve and have witnessed many problems associated with the sale of alcohol. I consider myself to be a competent and responsible operator with experienced well-trained staff. Notwithstanding this we as operators still experience problems with people in the area.

The extracts below are lifted from the incident book I keep; the original handwritten accounts are appended to this representation.

11/03/2021

Drunk people continuously roam around outside my shop and today they were much louder than usual. They began to make a ruckus outside my shop causing so much noise. This caused the neighbours to be disturbed and their children became panicked and felt unsafe. 13/07/2021

I experienced a physical and violent attack from a drunken person. He came into my shop asking for more alcohol. I politely told him I would not serve him due to the licensing laws. He responded in a violent manner and began attacking me, he tried to hit me many times and then broke a few wine bottles. I asked my neighbour for help with the incident and to remove the violent person from my shop.

14/10/2021

Today a young man came into my shop and approached me for help as he said to call the

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police whilst he began to close and lock the shop door. Another two men stood outside of my shop demanding me to open the door to allow them in. They wanted to both attack the first man who came into my shop, and I was worried a violent fight could happen. I took the first man out of the shop through the back doors as he was pleading with me to somehow save

05/06/2022

I witnessed criminal behaviour in my shop today when a young man ran into my shop suddenly and stood by the door in the hope of preventing two other men from getting in. As these two men could not get in, they broke the glass of my door and then left. Signed G. Wesley- DPS of the premises.

17/10/2022

Theft has occurred numerous times in my shop. This one incident involved a group of children who tried to steal alcohol and other items from my shop. I managed to stop them and asked them to calm down and leave my shop. Instead, they went outside and brought in a huge rock and attempted to throw it at me, but I dodged and was incredibly lucky to escape this as the consequences could have been terrible.

14/03/2023

I have experienced racism in my shop countless times, and I am unable to defend myself against violent and inhumane people. I was addressed with a racial slur of "paki" (a derogatory term for Pakistani) by a racist man and he continued to say this repeatedly. His harsh and rude treatment of me is something I was shocked by and I wish this could be solved.

Location of the Applicant's Premises and Assessment of the Area

8 Newton Drive is just less than 100 meters from my shop and less than 25 meters from the boundary line of the cumulative impact area.

Whilst the applicant's premises sit just outside the cumulative impact area (subject to the rebuttable presumption to refuse a licence) its proximity is so close that the grant of a licence is likely to have a marked effect.

Many Authorities in the Lancashire area do not have cumulative impact policies but still acknowledge that it is a relevant issue but are clear to point out that it is incumbent on any person making a representation based on cumulative impact that they must provide examples or evidence to justify those concerns. This principle is also established in Section 182 Guidance.

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Extract taken from Wyre Borough Council Statement of Licensing Policy

In the absence of a Cumulative Impact Policy for Wyre, the licensing authority may still consider representations where a body or person believes that an application (new or varied) will have a negative impact on one or more of the licensing objectives. If cumulative impact is being highlighted as the reason for an objection, the responsible authority or other person should state why the application will impact on the area of concern, what the implications will be and whenever possible produce examples or evidence. It may be that the type of premises or offering will attract more people into an already busy and problematic area, therefore impacting on the licensing objectives that address disorder and/or nuisance. This can apply to those premises who sell alcohol on or off the premises equally to those that do not (takeaways

Extract from South Ribble Borough Council Statement of Licensing Policy

17.2 The 'cumulative impact' of the granting of an additional licence, within a particular area, on the promotion of the licensing objectives is, however, a proper matter for the licensing authority to consider under this policy and it may adopt a Special Saturation Policy. Where the licensing authority receives representations from a responsible authority or an interested party that the cumulative effect of new licences is leading to an area becoming saturated with premises, making it a focal point for large groups to gather in and circulate away from the licensed premises themselves, and that this is creating problems of disorder and/or nuisance over and above the impact of the individual premises, the licensing authority can properly consider whether or not the granting of an additional licence might lead to one or more of the Licensing Objectives being undermined.

Extract from Blackpool Councils Statement of Licensing Policy

- 4.11 Representations based on Cumulative Impact outside the Cumulative Impact Areas
- 4.11.1 In cases where responsible authorities or other persons seek to establish that an application should be refused because it would result or further contribute to cumulative impact in an area not designated as a cumulative impact area, they should:
- Identify the boundaries of the area where the alleged problems are arising
- Identify the licensing objective(s) which are being undermined
- Identify the type of licensing activity alleged to be causing the problem
- Provide evidence to show that the undermining of the licensing objective is being caused by the patrons of those premises in the area carrying out that activity.

The Blackpool policy is the most helpful in providing a checklist for those making representations to cover.

The analysis below demonstrates the location and number of premises in the immediate vicinity and the examples provided in this representation demonstrate that issues prevail



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relating to the sale and supply of alcohol despite the competence and diligence of existing operators.
