APPLICATION FOR A PREMISES LICENCE – Premier, 83-85 Bond Street, Blackpool, FY4 1BW

1.0 Purpose of the report:

1.1 To consider an application for a new Premises Licence for Premier, 83-85 Bond Street, Blackpool, FY4 1BW

6.0 Background information

- 6.1 On 26 July 2023 the Licensing Service received an application from Mark Marshall of M Squared on behalf of Uma Nanthiny Agilan for a new Premises Licence for Premier, 83-85 Bond Street, Blackpool, FY4 1BW
The property has never held a Premises Licence before.
- 6.2 The application requests permission to sell alcohol for consumption off the premises 08.00 to 23.00 Monday to Sunday with opening hours also from 08:00 to 23:00 Monday to Sunday. The applicant has volunteered a number of conditions on the application form which will be attached to the Premises Licence if granted, a copy of the application is attached at Appendix 4a.
- 6.3 Representations have been received from Sergeant Nat Cox of Lancashire Constabulary. A copy of the representation is attached at Appendices 4b and Appendix 4c.
- 6.4 Local policy considerations:

The premises falls within the area covered by the Off Licence Cumulative Impact Assessment (CIA). The following sections of the policy are relevant:

4.9.1 The location of the main concentration of off-licensed premises suffers from high levels of alcohol related crime and alcohol related hospital admissions. Applications for new licences, or variation of hours within this area will be refused unless the applicant can demonstrate that their application will not lead to an increase in the impact of off licensed premises in this area.

4.10.1 Applications for new licences or variations to existing licences within a cumulative impact area, which are likely to add to the existing cumulative impact, will normally be refused if a relevant representation is received. To persuade the Council to depart from its policy an applicant must demonstrate that their application will not add to the existing cumulative impact in the area. This should be done through the operating schedule and the risk assessment process (if used).

4.10.4 Examples of factors the licensing authority will not consider to rebut the presumption of refusal:

- The premises will be well managed and run as all licensed premises should meet this standard
- The premises will be constructed to a high standard
- The applicant operates similar premises elsewhere without complaint.

4.10.6 Where representations are received the Council will consider the circumstances of each individual application and decide whether it would be justified in departing from its policy and CIA in the light of the individual circumstances of the case.

6.5 National policy considerations:

9.12 – Each responsible authority will be an expert in their respective field, and in some cases it is likely that a particular responsible authority will be the licensing authority’s main source of advice in relation to a particular licensing objective... any responsible authority under the 2003 Act may make representations with regard to any of the licensing objectives if they have evidence to support such representations. Licensing authorities must therefore consider all relevant representations from responsible authorities carefully... However, it remains incumbent on all responsible authorities to ensure that their representations can withstand the scrutiny to which they would be subject at a hearing.

9.43 – The authority’s decision should be evidence-based, justified as being appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives and proportionate to what it is intended to achieve.

14.44 – After receiving relevant representations in relation to a new application for... a licence or certificate, the licensing authority must consider whether it would be justified in departing from its CIA in the light of the individual circumstances of the case... If the licensing authority decides that an application should be refused, it will still need to show that the grant of the application would undermine the promotion of one or more of the licensing objectives and that appropriate conditions would be ineffective in preventing the problems involved.

- a) General – all four licensing objectives (b,c,d,and e) (please read guidance note 10)

b) The prevention of crime and disorder

1. CCTV will be installed at the premises and will comply with the following:
 - a. The CCTV system shall be installed, maintained, and operated to the reasonable satisfaction of the Lancashire Constabulary. The coverage should include the entrance/exit, checkout, and main alcohol displays. The system will be capable of providing an image that is regarded as an identification standard.
 - b. The system will display on any recording the correct time and date of the recording.
 - c. The system will make recordings during all hours the premises are open to the public.
 - d. The system will, as a minimum, record images of the head and shoulders of all persons entering the premises.
 - e. Digital recording shall be held for a minimum of 21 days after the recording is made and will be made available to the Police for inspection upon request.
2. A staff member who is conversant with the operation of the CCTV system will be available to attend the premises within an hour if requested by Police. This staff member will be able to show police recent data or footage with the absolute minimum of delay when requested. This data or footage reproduction should be almost instantaneous.

3. If the CCTV is not correctly working the Licence Holder shall take immediate steps to rectify the fault. A log of the steps shall be kept and be made available for inspection Police Officer or to a Local Authority Enforcement Officer.
4. Appropriate signage alerting customers to CCTV recordings shall be displayed in conspicuous positions on the premises.

c) Public Safety

Primary Legislation is deemed sufficient.

d) The prevention of public nuisance

5. The licence holder will place signs at the exit advising customers to leave the area quietly and respect the needs of residents

e) The protection of children from harm

6. A Challenge 25 proof of age policy shall be implemented and adhered to. Any person who looks or appears to be under the age of 25 shall be asked to provide identification that they are over the age of 18. The following are the only forms of identification acceptable:
 - A recognised proof of age scheme accredited under the British Retail Consortiums Proof of Age Standards Scheme (PASS).
 - Photo driving licence.
 - Passport.

- Official ID card issued by HM Forces or European Union bearing a photograph and date of birth of the holder.

If no suitable identification is provided the sale of alcohol will be refused.

7. All staff shall receive suitable training in relation to the proof of age scheme to be applied upon the premises. Records to evidence this shall be made available to an authorised officer upon request. Refresher training shall be conducted every 3 months as a minimum.

8. "Challenge 25" posters shall be displayed in prominent positions at the premises.

9. An authorisation, signed and dated by the Designated Premises Supervisor, shall be kept at the premises showing all persons authorised by them to make sales of alcohol at the premises.

10. A refusals/ challenges register to be kept and maintained which will be made available for inspection by a Police Constable or authorised officer and this register will be reviewed regularly by the Designated Premises Supervisor.





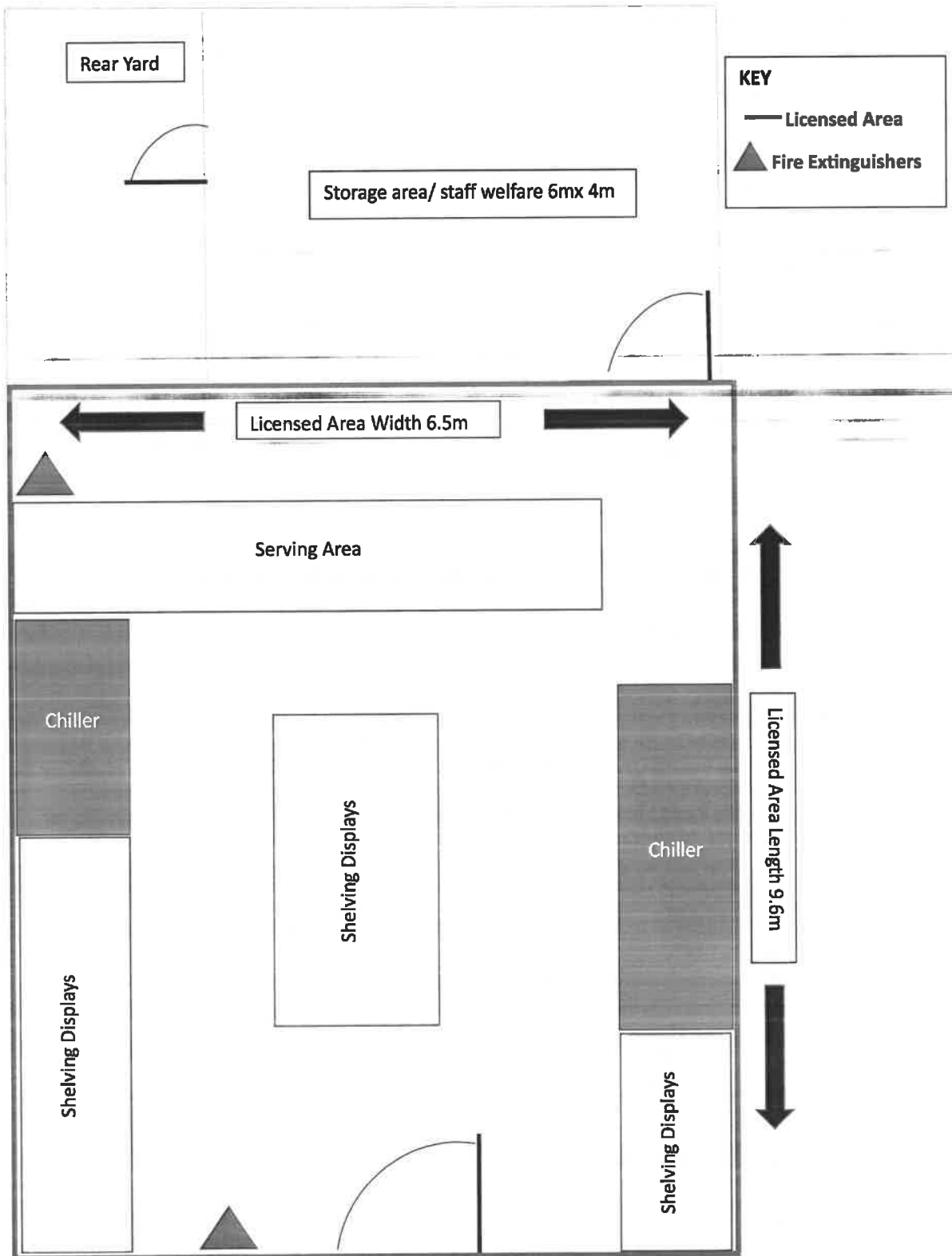

<p>I am in receipt of an application for a New Premises Licence for the above address. On behalf of the Chief Officer of Police having reviewed the application the Police wish to make a formal objection on the following grounds.</p> <p>The Police base the objection on the fact that the new premises is within the Off Licence Cumulative Impact Assessment Area. The purpose of this Policy is to create a rebuttable presumption that any applications such as the above will be refused a licence.</p> <p>The number, type and density of the premises selling alcohol in a particular area can lead to serious problems of nuisance and disorder. In these circumstances the impact of the premises taken as a whole can be far greater than that arising from individual premises. In most cases it would be impossible to identify an individual premise as being the sole cause or major contributing factor.</p>				

Appendix 4b

It is noted that Blackpool has high levels of alcohol related harm for the size of the population and has widespread deprivation within the Central Wards of the town. The number of licensed premises in Blackpool is above the national average, and many of them are located in the most deprived wards in the town.

This premises falls within the Waterloo Ward. This is one of the most deprived wards in Blackpool and is already well served with off licences, with 4 existing off licences on Bond Street alone.

The area is also high in crime; during the period August 2022 - July 2023, there were 77 offences recorded on Bond Street, and 9 of the 77 (12%) were Alcohol related offences. Waterloo ward is the 4th highest in Blackpool for crime, including alcohol-related crime.

Waterloo ward also features high on ASB incidents, with 587 incidents recorded in the same period, 6.6% of all ASB in Blackpool.

It is the opinion of the Police that this premises would add to the cumulative impact already being experienced in the area.

A hearing would allow the Licensing Committee to examine the prospective operators' intentions and rebut the presumption that the operation of the premises will add to the cumulative impact and therefore crime and disorder.

It is recommended that the licence should only be granted if the application is amended, or if conditions are applied, as detailed below.

Alcohol related Crime Blackpool

Data was obtained for the 1-year period 1st August 2022 – 31st July 2023 from Lancashire Constabulary's investigation recording system Connect and mapped and extracted for the relevant area Blackpool. The data was then filtered to contain offences that were alcohol related¹.

In relation to Bond Street, data was filtered using the address 1 column in order to obtain all offences that occurred on Bond Street for the period.

Lancashire Constabulary installed a new IT system on the 27th November 2018. Please note that crime data obtained from police crime intelligence system is subject to change. From dip sampling it is believed there is an underestimation due to issues with quality assurance, geocoding and additional coding problems.

Bond Street

- During the period August 2022 - July 2023, there were 77 offences recorded on Bond Street, and 9 of the 77 (12%) were Alcohol related offences.
- The below table shows the breakdown of all offences recorded for the period.
