APPLICATION FOR A PREMISES LICENCE – Trades Hotel, 51-55 Lord Street and 42 Banks Street

1.0 Purpose of the report:

1.1 To consider an application for a new Premises Licence for Trades Hotel, 51-55 Lord Street and 42 Banks Street

6.0 Background information

6.1 On 22 November 2023 the Licensing Service received an application from Mark Marshall of M Squared Services Ltd on behalf of Neil Cropper for a new Premises Licence for Trades Hotel, 51-55 Lord Street and 42 Banks Street.
Both sites currently have individual Premises Licences which will be surrendered if the new one is granted.

6.2 The application requests permission for Live Music (Indoors), Recorded Music (Indoors), and the Supply of Alcohol (On and Off the Premises) Monday to Sunday 10.00 to 04.00 also Late Night Refreshment (Indoors) Monday to Sunday 23.00 to 04.00 at the Lord Street site and Live Music (Indoors), Recorded Music (Indoors), and the Supply of Alcohol (On and Off the Premises) Monday to Sunday 10.00 to 02.00 also Late Night Refreshment (Indoors) Monday to Sunday 23.00 to 02.00 at the Banks Street site with opening hours 10.00 to 04.30 Monday to Sunday at Lord Street and 10.00 to 02.30 at Banks Street. The applicant has volunteered a number of conditions on the application form which will be attached to the Premises Licence if granted, a copy of the application is attached at Appendix 4(a). A mediation agreement has been agreed with the police and the applicant to reduce the terminal hour for licensable activities at the Lord Street site to 03.00, reduce the opening times at the Lord Street site to 03.30 and to remove Off sales for alcohol from the application. A number of additional conditions have also been added to the application.

6.3 Representation have been received from Angela Meldrum, Chloe Bergin and Angela Baddeley. Copies of the representations are attached at Appendix 4(b).

6.4 Local policy considerations:

3.2.3 Where relevant representations are made, the following factors will normally be taken into account:

- The style of operations, the number of customers and profile of customers expected to attend the premises
- The location of the premises and its proximity to noise sensitive properties
- The proposed hours of operation
- The transport arrangements for customers attending or leaving the premises and any possible impact on local residents or businesses
- The proposed methods for the dispersal of customers
 - The scope for mitigating any impact
 - The extent to which the applicant has offered conditions to mitigate the impact
- How often the activity occurs

4.4.2 The Council wishes to develop a diverse night-time economy but acknowledges that any licensable activity has the potential to impact adversely on the surrounding area either by disturbance caused by crime and disorder or by nuisance caused by customers being noisy when leaving/using on-street car parking. The impact of these activities can be greater at night when

ambient noise levels are much lower.

6.5 National policy considerations:

8.44 It is expected that enquiries about the locality will assist applicants when determining the steps that are appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives. For example, premises with close proximity to residential premises should consider what effect this will have on their smoking, noise management and dispersal policies to ensure the promotion of the public nuisance objective. Applicants must consider all factors which may be relevant to the promotion of the licensing objectives, and where there are no known concerns, acknowledge this in their application.

9.43 – The authority’s decision should be evidence-based, justified as being appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives and proportionate to what it is intended to achieve.

b) The prevention of crime and disorder

CCTV will be installed internally and externally at the premises and will comply with the following:

- i. The CCTV system shall be installed, maintained and operated to the reasonable satisfaction of Lancashire Constabulary. All public areas of the premises are to be covered by the system. The system will incorporate a camera covering each of the entrance doors and will be capable of providing an image which is regarded as identification standard.
- ii. The system will display on any recording the correct time and date of the recording.
- iii. The system will make recordings during all hours the premises are open to the public.

- iv. VCR tapes or digital recording shall be held for a minimum of 31 days and 28 days respectively, after the recording is made and will be made available to the Police or any authorised persons acting for a Responsible Authority for inspection upon request.
- v. The system will, as a minimum, record images of the head and shoulders of all persons entering the premises.

A staff member who is conversant with the operation of the CCTV system will be on the premises at all times the premises are open to the public. This staff member will be able to show recent data or footage with the absolute minimum of delay when requested to a Police Office or to a Local Authority Enforcement Officer.

The licence holder shall notify the Police licensing unit on any occasion when the CCTV is to be inoperative for a period in excess of one working day and shall provide a certificate from a competent person stating the reason for the system being inoperative and the measures which have been taken to satisfy the licence conditions.

Appropriate signage alerting customers to CCTV recording shall be displayed in conspicuous positions on the premises.

Bi-annually documented maintenance checks of the CCTV system, including the recording system, will be undertaken by the licence holder to ensure that the system is in good working order and fit for purpose.

Risk assessments carried out by or on behalf of the licence holder which relate to a licensing objective will be available for inspection by an officer or a responsible authority.

At least one personal licence holder will be available on the licensed premises while the supply or sale of alcohol is being undertaken (whose identity will be known to all other staff engaged in the supply or sale of alcohol) except in the case of emergency.

Security arrangements are sufficient to discourage the sale and consumption of drugs and shall ensure such arrangements include regular checks of toilet areas.

A drugs prevention strategy for the venue shall be developed, applied and documented.

Confiscated and found drugs shall be stored, disposed, transferred in accordance with procedures agreed with Lancashire Constabulary.

Clearly visible notices, in a form prescribed by the Council, shall be displayed advising those attending that:

- 1. It is a condition of entry that customers agree to be searched, and
- 2. Police will be informed if anyone is found in possession of controlled substances or weapons.

An incident book will be maintained, in which shall be recorded:

- i. All incidents of crime and disorder
- ii. Refused sales to suspected under age / drunken persons
- iii. A record of any person refused admission or asked to leave the premises.
- iv. Details of occasions upon which the Police are called to the premises.
- v. The use or discovery of drugs.

Frequent collection of glasses and bottles will be undertaken to ensure that empty containers do not accumulate in or around the licensed premises.

Functions which specifically target young people aged 18 years old (for example birthday parties) will not be allowed to take place on the premises.

An adequate number of licensed door supervisors will be on duty as appropriate to any risk assessment, however, a minimum of 1 SIA registered door staff member will be on duty from 21.00 to 04.00 every Friday and Saturday and on every bank holiday Sunday. Any member of door staff must wear a high visibility jacket and will only conduct security duties and will not act as a bar person or DPS.

No person will be admitted into the premises beyond 03.30 hours other than residents of the hotel.

The Bank Street side of the premises will operate primarily as a dining and bistro establishment. This half of the premises will have seating to accommodate 75% of its safe capacity and will not operate as a vertical drinking establishment.

No Licensable activity will take place beyond 2am in the Bank Street side of the premises.

c) Public Safety

Primary Legislation deemed sufficient to safeguard this objective

d) The prevention of public nuisance

Signs will be posted at exits reminding customers of the need to leave the premises quietly and with respect for residents.

The consumption of alcohol will not be permitted beyond 22.00hrs in any of the outdoor areas.

e) The protection of children from harm

No person under 18 will be allowed on the premises.

All staff to have received suitable training in relation to the proof of age scheme to be applied upon the premises. Records to evidence this will be made available to an authorised officer upon request.

All bar staff employed at the premises shall have successfully completed a recognised Training Course for Personal Licence Holders.

Dear Blackpool Planning / licensing Authority

I am writing to express my serious concerns and objection to the recent proposal by Trades Hotel to sell alcohol at the newly connected onto Trades hotel by a hole in a corridor Moore's Hotel on Banks Street, Blackpool.

As a resident living directly opposite the Moore's Hotel, I have grave concerns regarding the potential noise anti social behaviours that were associated with Kaos and disturbances that the issuance of a late-night alcohol license would bring to our predominantly residential street. The loud music, increased traffic from taxis and cars, and the likelihood of shouting and other disturbances is distressing, especially considering the presence of children and disabled individuals in the neighbourhood.

Furthermore, several new houses developed by "My Blackpool Homes" are situated next door, including homes with young children and a disabled child. The tranquility of their living environment should be a priority. In addition, the adjacent bed and breakfast, managed by my neighbour Jeff, caters to an older clientele who value peace and quiet. The noise and activity associated with a late-night licensed premises would undoubtedly deter guests, impacting his livelihood.

Public safety is another major concern. With increased foot traffic and potential for rowdy behavior, the safety of residents, their properties, and vehicles parked on the street could be at risk.

While I understand that Lord Street is more commercially oriented, it is important to recognize that Banks Street, particularly the section in question, is residential in nature. The introduction of a late-night alcohol-serving establishment would significantly alter the character and atmosphere of our community.

I urge you to consider the impact this decision would have on the residents of Banks Street and to prioritize the well-being and peace of our community. Please do not let this proposal go ahead.

How to make representations

What are the Rights of an Interested Party?

An Interested Party can make representations in relation to an application, **which by law must be forwarded to the applicant to enable a dialogue to take place between the various parties to allow an amicable resolution to the issues raised.** If they cannot reach agreement then the Interested Party can present their objection at a hearing of the Licensing Committee. Representations must not be frivolous, repetitive or vexatious. Interested Parties must ensure that their objections are factually correct and substantial.

What can my representation relate to?

The representations must relate to 'The Licensing Objectives', which are:

- The Protection of Children,
- The Prevention of Nuisance,
- The Protection of Public Safety and
- The Prevention of Crime & Disorder.

Any objection, which does not relate to one or more of the licensing objectives will not be considered. Similarly planning matters will not be reconsidered and the licensing hearings will not be a rerun of contested planning decisions.

How do I make a representation?

It must be made in writing to the licensing service. A form is attached for this purpose. You must state the grounds upon which you are making representations. You should note that at the hearing you can only rely on the grounds stated within your notice.

Can I be represented?

You may put forward your representation yourself, or you may ask a solicitor or friend to assist you. If you appear or are represented your objection may be subject to cross-examination by the applicant or the applicant's representative or by members of the committee.

What happens next?

The committee can approve the application or decide to uphold your objection and refuse the application or they can apply whatever conditions they believe to be adequate to ensure that the premises will not breach the licensing objectives.
