#### **APPLICATION FOR A PREMISES LICENCE – MR CHEF**

#### 1.0 Purpose of the report:

1.1 To consider an application for a New Premises Licence for Mr Chef, 96-98 Talbot Road, Blackpool, FY1 1LR.

#### 2.0 Recommendation(s):

2.1 The Panel is requested to consider the application and determine whether the granting of this licence would adversely impact on the Licensing Objectives.

#### 3.0 Reasons for recommendation(s):

- 3.1 Representations have been received therefore there must be a hearing to determine the application.
- 3.2 Is the recommendation contrary to a plan or strategy adopted or approved by the Council?
- 3.3 Is the recommendation in accordance with the Council's approved budget? Yes

#### 4.0 Other alternative options to be considered:

4.1 None, once an application is submitted and representations received it must be considered by the Licensing Panel.

#### 5.0 Council priority:

- 5.1 The relevant Council priority is
  - "The economy: Maximising growth and opportunity across Blackpool"

#### 6.0 Background information

6.1 On 26<sup>th</sup> January 2024 the Licensing Service received an application from Mr Solima Fathy Salama for a new Premises Licence at Mr Chef, 96-98 Talbot Road, Blackpool, FY1 1LR. The property has never held a Premises Licence.

- The application requests Late Night Refreshment Monday to Sunday 23:00 05:00 with opening hours from 12.00 05.00 Monday to Sunday. The applicant has volunteered a number of conditions on the application form which will be attached to the Premises Licence if granted, a copy of the application is attached at Appendix 4(a).
- 6.3 Representations have been received from the Licensing Authority and Lancashire Constabulary. Copies of the representations are attached at Appendices 4(b) and 4(c).
- 6.4 Local policy considerations:
  - 3.2.3 Where relevant representations are made, the following factors will normally be taken into account:
  - The style of operations, the number of customers and profile of customers expected to attend the premises
  - The location of the premises and its proximity to noise sensitive properties
  - The proposed hours of operation
  - The transport arrangements for customers attending or leaving the premises and any possible impact on local residents or businesses
  - The proposed methods for the dispersal of customers
  - The scope for mitigating any impact
  - The extent to which the applicant has offered conditions to mitigate the impact
  - How often the activity occurs
  - 4.4.2 The Council wishes to develop a diverse night-time economy but acknowledges that any licensable activity has the potential to impact adversely on the surrounding area either by disturbance caused by crime and disorder or by nuisance caused by customers being noisy when leaving/using on-street car parking. The impact of these activities can be greater at night when ambient noise levels are much lower.

The premises falls within the area covered by the Cumulative Impact Assessment (CIA).

The following sections of the policy are relevant:

- 4.10.1 Applications for new licences or variations to existing licences within a cumulative impact area, which are likely to add to the existing cumulative impact, will normally be refused if a relevant representation is received. To persuade the Council to depart from its policy an applicant must demonstrate that their application will not add to the existing cumulative impact in the area. This should be done through the operating schedule and the risk assessment process (if used).
- 4.10.4 Examples of factors the licensing authority will not consider to rebut the presumption of refusal:

- The premises will be well managed and run as all licensed premises should meet this standard
- The premises will be constructed to a high standard
- The applicant operates similar premises elsewhere without complaint.
- 4.10.6 Where representations are received the Council will consider the circumstances of each individual application and decide whether it would be justified in departing from its policy and CIA in the light of the individual circumstances of the case.
- 6.5 National policy considerations:
  - 2.15 The 2003 Act enables licensing authorities and responsible authorities, through representations, to consider what constitutes public nuisance and what is appropriate to prevent it in terms of conditions attached to specific premises licences and club premises certificates. It is therefore important that in considering the promotion of this licensing objective, licensing authorities and responsible authorities focus on the effect of the licensable activities at the specific premises on persons living and working (including those carrying on business) in the area around the premises which may be disproportionate and unreasonable.
  - 9.12 Each responsible authority will be an expert in their respective field, and in some cases it is likely that a particular responsible authority will be the licensing authority's main source of advice in relation to a particular licensing objective... any responsible authority under the 2003 Act may make representations with regard to any of the licensing objectives if they have evidence to support such representations. Licensing authorities must therefore consider all relevant representations from responsible authorities carefully... However, it remains incumbent on all responsible authorities to ensure that their representations can withstand the scrutiny to which they would be subject at a hearing.
  - 9.43 The authority's decision should be evidence-based, justified as being appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives and proportionate to what it is intended to achieve.
  - 14.44 After receiving relevant representations in relation to a new application for... a licence or certificate, the licensing authority must consider whether it would be justified in departing from its CIA in the light of the individual circumstances of the case... If the licensing authority decides that an application should be refused, it will still need to show that the grant of the application would undermine the promotion of one or more of the licensing objectives and that appropriate conditions would be ineffective in preventing the problems involved.

NOTES ON DEMONSTRATING ENTITLEMENT TO WORK IN THE UK	

### Entitlement to work/immigration status for individual applicants and applications from partnerships which are not limited liability partnerships:

A licence may not be held by an individual or an individual in a partnership who is resident in the UK who:

- does not have the right to live and work in the UK; or
- is subject to a condition preventing him or her from doing work relating to the carrying on of a licensable activity.

Any premises licence issued in respect of an application made on or after 6 April 2017 will become invalid if the holder ceases to be entitled to work in the UK.

Applicants must demonstrate that they have an entitlement to work in the UK and are not subject to a condition preventing them from doing work relating to the carrying on of a licensable activity. They do this in one of two ways: 1) by providing with this application copies or scanned copies of the documents listed below (which do not need to be certified), or 2) by providing their 'share code' to enable the licensing authority to carry out a check using the Home Office online right to work checking service (see below).

#### Documents which demonstrate entitlement to work in the UK

- An expired or current passport showing the holder, or a person named in the passport as the child of the holder, is A British citizen or a citizen of the UK and Colonies having the right of abode in the UK [please see note below about which sections of the passport to copy].
- An expired or current passport or national identity card showing the holder, or a person named in the passport as the child of the holder, is a national of a European Economic Area country or Switzerland.
- A Registration Certificate or document certifying permanent residence issued by the Home Office to a national of a European Economic Area country or Switzerland.
- A Permanent Residence Card issued by the Home Office to the family member of a national of a European Economic Area country or Switzerland.
- A current Biometric Immigration Document (Biometric Residence Permit) issued by the Home Office to the holder indicating that the person named is allowed to stay indefinitely in the UK, or has no time limit on their stay in the UK.
- A current passport endorsed to show that the holder is exempt from immigration control, is allowed to stay
  indefinitely in the UK, has the right of abode in the UK, or has no time limit on their stay in the UK.
- A **current** Immigration Status Document issued by the Home Office to the holder with an endorsement indicating that the named person is allowed to stay indefinitely in the UK or has no time limit on their stay in the UK, **when produced in combination with** an official document giving the person's permanent National Insurance number and their name issued by a Government agency or a previous employer.
- A birth or adoption certificate issued in the UK, when produced in combination with an official document giving the person's permanent National Insurance number and their name issued by a Government agency or a previous employer.
- A birth or adoption certificate issued in the Channel Islands, the Isle of Man or Ireland when produced in
  combination with an official document giving the person's permanent National Insurance number and their
  name issued by a Government agency or a previous employer.
- A certificate of registration or naturalisation as a British citizen, when produced in combination with an
  official document giving the person's permanent National Insurance number and their name issued by a
  Government agency or a previous employer.

- A current passport endorsed to show that the holder is allowed to stay in the UK and is currently allowed to
  work and is not subject to a condition preventing the holder from doing work relating to the carrying on of a
  licensable activity.
- A **current** Biometric Immigration Document (Biometric Residence Permit) issued by the Home Office to the holder which indicates that the named person can currently stay in the UK and is allowed to work relation to the carrying on of a licensable activity.
- A **current** Residence Card issued by the Home Office to a person who is not a national of a European Economic Area state or Switzerland but who is a family member of such a national or who has derivative rights or residence.
- A current Immigration Status Document containing a photograph issued by the Home Office to the holder
  with an endorsement indicating that the named person may stay in the UK, and is allowed to work and is not
  subject to a condition preventing the holder from doing work relating to the carrying on of a licensable activity
  when produced in combination with an official document giving the person's permanent National Insurance
  number and their name issued by a Government agency or a previous employer.
- A Certificate of Application, less than 6 months old, issued by the Home Office under regulation 18(3) or 20(2) of the Immigration (European Economic Area) Regulations 2016, to a person who is not a national of a European Economic Area state or Switzerland but who is a family member of such a national or who has derivative rights of residence.
- Reasonable evidence that the person has an outstanding application to vary their permission to be in the UK with the Home Office such as the Home Office acknowledgement letter or proof of postage evidence, or reasonable evidence that the person has an appeal or administrative review pending on an immigration decision, such as an appeal or administrative review reference number.
- Reasonable evidence that a person who is not a national of a European Economic Area state or Switzerland but
  who is a family member of such a national or who has derivative rights of residence in exercising treaty rights in
  the UK including:-
  - evidence of the applicant's own identity such as a passport,
  - evidence of their relationship with the European Economic Area family member e.g. a marriage certificate, civil partnership certificate or birth certificate, and
  - evidence that the European Economic Area national has a right of permanent residence in the UK or is one of the following if they have been in the UK for more than 3 months:
    - (i) working e.g. employment contract, wage slips, letter from the employer,
    - (ii) self-employed e.g. contracts, invoices, or audited accounts with a bank,
    - (iii) studying e.g. letter from the school, college or university and evidence of sufficient funds; or
    - (iv) self-sufficient e.g. bank statements.

Family members of European Economic Area nationals who are studying or financially independent must also provide evidence that the European Economic Area national and any family members hold comprehensive sickness insurance in the UK. This can include a private medical insurance policy, an EHIC card or an S1, S2 or S3 form.

**Original documents must not be sent to licensing authorities.** If the document copied is a passport, a copy of the following pages should be provided:-

- (i) any page containing the holder's personal details including nationality;
- (ii) any page containing the holder's photograph;
- (iii) any page containing the holder's signature;
- (iv) any page containing the date of expiry; and
- (v) any page containing information indicating the holder has permission to enter or remain in the UK and is permitted to work.

If the document is not a passport, a copy of the whole document should be provided.

Your right to work will be checked as part of your licensing application and this could involve us checking your immigration status with the Home Office. We may otherwise share information with the Home Office. Your licence application will not be determined until you have complied with this guidance.

#### Home Office online right to work checking service

As an alternative to providing a copy of the documents listed above, applicants may demonstrate their right to work by allowing the licensing authority to carry out a check with the Home Office online right to work checking service.

To demonstrate their right to work via the Home Office online right to work checking service, applicants should include in this application their 9-digit share code (provided to them upon accessing the service at <a href="https://www.gov.uk/prove-right-to-work">https://www.gov.uk/prove-right-to-work</a>) which, along with the applicant's date of birth (provided within this application), will allow the licensing authority to carry out the check.

In order to establish the applicant's right to work, the check will need to indicate that the applicant is allowed to work in the United Kingdom and is not subject to a condition preventing them from doing work relating to the carrying on of a licensable activity.

An online check will not be possible in all circumstances because not all applicants will have an immigration status that can be checked online. The Home Office online right to work checking service sets out what information and/or documentation applicants will need in order to access the service. Applicants who are unable to obtain a share code from the service should submit copy documents as set out above.

NOTES ON REGULATED ENTERTAINMENT

In terms of specific regulated entertainments please note that:

- Plays: no licence is required for performances between 08:00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.



#### Reasons for making representations

I am in receipt of an application for a New Premises Licence for the above address. On behalf of the Chief Officer of Police having reviewed the application the Police wish to make a formal objection on the grounds of the prevention of crime and disorder, the protection of public safety and prevention of public nuisance.

This application would allow the operation of another Takeaway open until 5am or later in a high crime area with a number of similar establishments. The authorities have observed the problems which have been caused by large number of people leaving alcohol led licensed premises and not dispersing. Instead, large numbers remain in the area using the takeaways or just socialising in the street. Street drinkers and youths looking for trouble have also been attracted to this area hoping to take advantage of the vulnerable and intoxicated.

These issues impact local residents and workers going about their daily business because calls to disorder can be received up to 6.45 am. Whilst the

problems and associated disorder cannot be attributed to individual premises the Police are of the view that these establishments contribute significantly to the problems because if they were not open for business there would be less incentive for revellers to remain in the area.

This premises is situated on Talbot Road near to the junction with Dickson, opposite Ma Kelly's and therefore was included in the cumulative impact zone area as of February this year, which recognises the problems experienced in this area. Attached to this representation is recent Police incident data which shows the hours between 01:00 and 03:59 to have higher crime times in comparison to most daylight hours.

The applicant for this new premises Mr Soliman Salama is already the Premises Licence Holder for Tasty on The Strand and until 16<sup>th</sup> February also Hot Stuff on Queen Street, both of which are licensed until 5am. As well as the concern of adding another high-risk premises to his portfolio, the Police are concerned that the applicant will not uphold the licensing objectives as he was found to be in breach of his licence at 03:15hrs on 16<sup>th</sup> December 2023 by having no door supervisors on duty at either of his premises during this busy Christmas period.

The Police feel that if this licence was granted it would only add to the already high crime, disorder and anti-social behaviour issues experienced in this immediate vicinity therefore the Police object to this application.

It is recommended that the licence should only be granted if the application is amended, or if conditions are applied, as detailed below.

## 96 Talbot Road, Blackpool

Data was obtained for the 1-year period 1<sup>st</sup> February 2023 – 1<sup>st</sup> February 2024 from Lancashire Constabulary's recording systems. Data was mapped and then extracted from within the boundary area of a 100m radius of 96 Talbot Road (shown on the map below).



Blue circles represent ASB incidents, red squares represent crime.

Between 1<sup>st</sup> February 2023 and 1<sup>st</sup> February 2024, there were 416 crimes and 134 ASB incidents recorded within a 100m radius of 96 Talbot Road, Blackpool.

39% of the crime (n=164) occurred between 0000hrs and 0700hrs.

23.8% of the ASB incidents (n=32) occurred between 0000hrs and 0700hrs

57% of the overnight crimes included the two peak crime sub-types, Violence with Injury and Violence without Injury.

There have been 26 acquisitive crimes committed between the hours of 0000hrs – 0700hrs, in the period. The crimes included shoplifting, theft from a person, burglary, robbery, other theft and theft of motor vehicles.

#### **Crime Times**

Due to night-time economy in the area, the hours of 0100hrs – 0359hrs (1-3) each already show as higher crime times in comparison to most daylight hours.

0000hrs – 0700hrs - Where the gender of victims is recorded (119 crimes), 75% (n=89) were male and 25% (n=30) were female.

Of the 134 ASB incidents which were recorded, at all hours, within 100m of 96 Talbot Road, Blackpool, during the period, 84% (n=113) were nuisance incidents and 15.6% (n=21) were personal incidents.

On Saturday 16<sup>th</sup> December at 0317 hours a Police Officer conducted a check of the above premises and found there was no door supervisor present.

I would advise that in accordance with section 136 (1) of The Licensing Act 2003 "A person commits an offence if a) he carries on or attempts to carry on a licensable activity on or from any premises otherwise than in accordance with an authorisation, b) he knowingly allows a licensable activity to be so carried on".

The maximum penalty for this offence is six months imprisonment and/or an unlimited fine.

The location of the premises and the proposed use for late night refreshments until 5am require the application be determined with consideration of the Council's current statement of licensing policy and cumulative impact assessment.


#### **Policy Considerations**
