Dear Mr. Unsworth

Following my phone call to register my objection to the Boards Head being granted a licence to play amplified music and to stay open later at weekends, as requested I am putting my objection in writing.

This is a residential area with a mixture of

elderly people and families with young children, this is not a suitable area to have late openings and amplified music being played, there is already enough disturbance from customers of the pub without increasing the potential noise & nuisance levels to the neighbourhood.

I realise the owners/landlords have spent a lot of money, they informed me personally the windows being installed to reduce the noise cost £25000 but that will do nothing for the noise having the doors constantly opening & closing with customers entering & leaving

or in and out to the smoking area opposite where I live.

The landlord/owner told me a licence is granted on a provisional licence and if the noise is too bad for the neighbours or anyone complains the licence will not be made permanent, you then informed me this was not true. This has made me doubt the integrity of the Bear's Head commitment to the upset & well being of the neighbours peace & stress levels? I was going to suggest a trial period to have the noise and disturbance levels assessed and monitored but now I

object strongly to the granting  
of the licence applied for by

There is already problems with  
litter and parking at weekends  
encouraging more customers by  
wanting to play live music and

for the residents, and the landlord  
has already proven to me he is  
prepared to lie to get his  
own way.
