# **APPLICATION FOR A PREMISES LICENCE- PIZZALAND**

## 1.0 Purpose of the report:

1.1 To consider an application for a premises licence from Pizzaland and the relevant representations from Lancashire Constabulary.

#### 4.0 Background Information

4.1 On 7th May 2014, the licensing service received an application for a premises licence at Pizzaland, 288 Devonshire Road Blackpool. The application requests permission to provide late night refreshment as follows:

Sunday - Thursday 23.00 until 00.00 hours Friday-Saturday 23.00 until 01.00 hours

- 4.2 The applicant is Morteza Dehghan
- 4.3 Representations have been received from Lancashire Constabulary.

#### 4.4 National Guidance

The following paragraphs of the guidance are relevant:

- 9.12 " In their role as a responsible authority, the police are an essential source of advice and information on the impact and potential impact of licensable activities, particularly on the crime and disorder objective. The police have a key role in managing the night-time economy and should have good working relationships with those operating in their local area. The police should be the licensing authority's main source of advice on matters relating to the promotion of the crime and disorder licensing objective, but may also be able to make relevant representations with regard to the other licensing objectives if they have evidence to support such representations. The licensing authority should accept all reasonable and proportionate representations made by the police unless the authority has evidence that to do so would not be appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives. However, it remains incumbent on the police to ensure that their representations can withstand the scrutiny to which they would be subject at a hearing.
- 9.38 Licensing authorities are best placed to determine what actions are appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives in their areas. All licensing determinations should be considered on a case-by-case basis.
- 9.39 The authority's determination should be evidence-based, justified as being appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives and proportionate to what it is intended to achieve.
- 9.40 Determination of whether an action or step is appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives requires an assessment of what action or step would be suitable to achieve that end. Whilst this does not therefore require a licensing authority to decide that no lesser step will achieve the aim, the authority should aim to consider the potential burden that the condition would impose on the premises

licence holder (such as the financial burden due to restrictions on licensable activities) as well as the potential benefit in terms of the promotion of the licensing objectives.
