## LGA CORPORATE PEER CHALLENGE RESPONSE

### 1.0 Purpose of the report:

- 1.1 To provide an update on actions progressing the recommendations of the Local Government Association's Corporate Peer Challenge (visit March 2020, final report received Nov 2020), and to approve the Council's formal response to the Peer Challenge report.

- 3.1 Substantial work has been undertaken to address the issues and recommendations highlighted in the Peer Challenge report, and the further actions planned will ensure sustainable improvements to the Council's corporate capacity and approach.

## 6.0 Background information

- 6.1 Corporate Peer Challenges are part of the Local Government Association’s sector-led improvement support offer, and generally take place at 4-5 year intervals. The Local Government Association stresses that they are not inspections. Rather, they provide a “critical friend” analysis of the Council’s response to its context and challenges. The Peer Challenge Team gather information via 1-1 interviews and by reviewing a range of reports and strategies. The Peer Challenge team then turn their findings into a report, and make recommendations that are for the Council to consider. Most Councils go on to publish both the Peer Challenge report and their response.
- 6.2 The Local Government Association’s Peer Challenge team visited the Council in March 2020, very shortly before the global pandemic had dramatic consequences for the organisation, town, and wider UK. The pandemic inevitably caused a significant delay in the production of the report. The Council received the final version of the report in November 2020, and this is included as Appendix 2a to the Executive report. As a result of prioritising the emergency demands of the pandemic – and the reality that we had already started to deliver against most of the recommendations – the Council did not begin to draft a formal response to the Peer Challenge until the summer of 2021.
- 6.3 The Council’s response to the recommendations is included at Appendix 2b to the Executive report. As can be seen, the Council accepts the majority of recommendations; where the Council has a different view, this is explained. The Council’s response explains how the Council has already made substantial progress in addressing the majority of recommendations and issues identified, in some cases going beyond their original scope. This is despite the significant and ongoing impacts of the pandemic, which was starting to take hold around the time of the onsite element of the peer review.
- 6.4 The Council will continue to consider how targeted support from the Local Government Association should form part of its overall approach to corporate improvement, inviting them to undertake further reviews where they will add value.
