DIVISION LANE – JUNCTION IMPROVEMENTS

1.0 Purpose of the report:

- 1.1 To approve a cash bond to Lancashire County Council as surety for the works to upgrade Division Lane and Common Edge Junction.
- 1.2 To approve entering into a bond agreement with an approved roads bondsman as surety for the works to upgrade Division Lane and Common Edge Junction.

2.0 Recommendation(s):

2.1 To approve a cash bond or bond agreement with an approved roads bondsman for surety for the upgrade of Division Lane and Common Edge Junction and delegate to Blackpool Council's Legal Department to proceed with whichever is more expedient and cost effective.

3.0 Reasons for recommendation(s):

Planning permission was granted by Fylde Borough Council on 8 June 2022 for the construction of a 3 g football pitch, provision of a grass rugby pitch and training area alongside an ancillary changing and spectator building, extension to existing car park with junction works to the existing access road and the creation of a new footway and cycle way to link facilities to common edge road.

Condition 6 of the decision notice stated that no part of the development hereby approved shall be brought in to use until an improvement scheme for the construction of the site access with the B5261 and the off-site works of highway improvement have been submitted to, and approved by the Local Planning Authority.

Following the submission of plans for offsite highway works to Fylde Council, Lancashire County Council have approved the design and have agreed to enter into a section 8 agreement with Blackpool Councils Legal Department. However, in order for Blackpool Council to undertake the works, the County Council now requires surety in the form of an approved bondsman or a cash deposit.

The section 8 agreement with associated bond is there to protect the County Council against the contractor defaulting, or if the works are not carried out to the satisfaction of the highway authority, as standard practice, particularly with private developers.

It is now standard procedure that all councils who undertake highway works on the adopted highway network throughout Lancashire have the appropriate legal agreement which is supported by a bond or a surety.

- 5.1 Blackpool Council have been granted planning permission for the first phase of the EZ sports development to improve access into the sports pavilion positioned off Division Lane west and the County Council require Blackpool Council to undertake a section 8 agreement with associated bond.
- 5.2 90% of the Bond will be paid back to Blackpool Council on completion of the works.

 The further 10% will be held as retention for 12 months as surety against defects and
