A Post Office spokesman said: "We recognise some customers may be concerned about carrying out their Post Office business in a different type of environment from what they are used to."

"The new postmaster is keen to offer Post Office services and is looking forward to welcoming customers."

"The Wine Shop will be changing its name and retail offer to provide a wider range of convenience and retail goods, alongside Post Office products and services."

"We already have a number of branches successfully operating from similar types of premises and would like to reassure customers that this doesn't compromise the professional service that we expect to be provided at all our Post Office branches."

The change has been prompted by the retirement of the current postmaster and his wife.

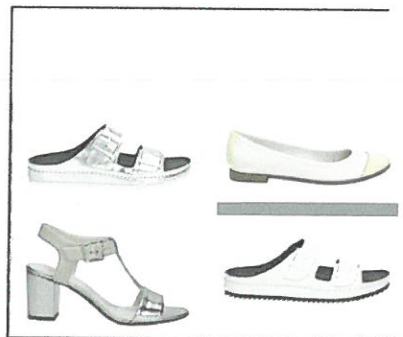
