Highfurlong School Extension

1.0 Purpose of the report:

1.1 To approve the appointment of Conlon Construction Ltd [Preston] as the contractor for the construction of the Highfurlong School extension.

2.0 Recommendation(s):

2.1 To approve the appointment of Conlon Construction Ltd as the contractor for the construction of the Highfurlong School extension. The contract is for a period of 12 months with an anticipated commencement date of May 2023.

3.0 Reasons for recommendation(s):

A competitive tendering exercise was undertaken during February – March 2023 to select a contractor to construct the school extension. The Council invited tenders through its etendering portal (The Chest), using a Procure Partnerships Framework (Procure North West) in compliance with the Public Contract Regulations 2015.

An expression of interest was issued to nine framework contractors and returned by four contractors. These four contractors were then invited to tender for the works through a single stage mini-competition process. One bidder withdrew during the process and tenders were received by three bidders.

Following completion of the evaluation Conlon Construction Ltd provided the best overall tender for the requirement and it is the Council's intention to enter into a formal agreement.

This recommendation is subject to value engineering work to be undertaken prior to contract award at no cost to the Council to bring the cost of the scheme in line with the funding envelope.

5.0 Background Information

The aim of this project is to provide a new teaching block at the existing Highfurlong School so that the school has adequate capacity to meet the needs of current and prospective pupils. Teaching space will also be created for pupils over the age of 16 to allow them to develop life skills in the transition stage to adulthood. The project will also see the creation of a café space on the ground floor, it is envisaged that this will predominantly be staffed by pupils and will also serve as an out of hours community centre that past and present pupils can visit. The project will be funded by Blackpool Council.

The objectives of the project are to:

- 1. Provide a new school building that will allow Highfurlong School to meet the needs of its current and future cohort of students.
- 2. Provide a new café space on the ground floor that can be used as a community hub for past and present pupils along with local community groups.
- 3. Make good use of financial resources by delivering a cost effective development;

4. Support the local economy by maximising the use of locally-based building contractors and local labour, and by providing training opportunities to young people in the area.
