APPLICATION FOR A PREMISES LICENCE – Barrons Hotel, 58 – 60 Hornby Road, Blackpool, FY1 4QJ

1.0 Purpose of the report:

1.1 To consider an application for a New Premises Licence for Barrons Hotel, 58 – 60 Hornby Road, Blackpool, FY1 4QJ.

2.0 Recommendation(s):

6.0 Background information

6.1 On 17th January 2024 the Licensing Service received an application from Mr Jose Sanchez on behalf of Cube Hotels Blackpool Ltd for a new Premises Licence at 58 – 60 Hornby Road, Blackpool, FY1 4QJ. The new application is a result of the previous licence lapsing due to the company that held that Premises Licence (Deneaspa Limited) showing as being dissolved on Companies House on 26 September 2023. This was discovered in January 2024 following a data cleanse on all licences by Licensing Officers. Deneaspa Limited (also owned by Mr Sanchez) held the previous licence since October 2022.

6.2 The application requests live music (Indoors and Outdoors) Friday to Sunday 12.00 – 23.00, recorded music (Indoors and Outdoors) Monday to Sunday 08.00 – 23.00, permission to sell alcohol (for consumption on and off the premises) Monday to Sunday 00.00 – 00.00, the provision of late night refreshment (Indoors) Monday to Sunday 23.00 – 05.00. The Premises would only be open to the public Monday to Sunday 11.00 – 23.00. The applicant has offered a number of conditions to be placed on the Premises Licence, plus additional conditions have been agreed with the Police by way of Mediation. A copy of the application is attached at Appendix 4a and the Police mediation at Appendix 4b.

6.3 A representation has been received from Councillor Mark Smith. A copy of the representation is attached at Appendix 4c.

6.4 Local policy considerations:

4.4.2 - The Council wishes to develop a diverse night-time economy but acknowledges that any licensable activity has the potential to impact adversely on the surrounding area either by disturbance caused by crime and disorder or by nuisance caused by customers being noisy when leaving/using on-street car parking. The impact of these activities can be greater at night when ambient noise levels are much lower.

6.5 National policy considerations:

9.12 - Each responsible authority will be an expert in their respective field, and in some cases it is likely that a particular responsible authority will be the licensing authority's main source of advice in relation to a particular licensing objective. For example, the police have a key role in managing the night-time economy and should have good working relationships with those operating in their local area⁵. The police should usually therefore be the licensing authority's main source of advice on matters relating to the promotion of the crime and disorder licensing objective. However, any responsible authority under the 2003 Act may make representations with regard to any of the licensing objectives if they have evidence to support such representations. Licensing authorities must therefore consider all relevant representations from responsible authorities carefully, even where the reason for a particular responsible authority's interest or expertise in the promotion of a particular objective may not be immediately apparent. However, it remains incumbent

on all responsible authorities to ensure that their representations can withstand the scrutiny to which they would be subject at a hearing.

9.43 – The authority’s decision should be evidence-based, justified as being appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives and proportionate to what it is intended to achieve.

If the C.C.T.V. equipment fails, then Police and the Licensing Authority will be informed immediately by telephone and immediate steps will be taken to put the equipment back into working order.

A notice will be displayed at the entrance to the premises advising that C.C.T.V. is in operation.

At least one C.C.T.V. camera will be in operation at the front of the premises at all times when the premises is in use.

Bottles and glasses

Alcohol and soft drinks will be served in plastic or toughened glasses.

All bottles sold will be made of plastic (where available).

Where glass bottles are to be used the contents will be decanted into plastic or toughened glasses where it is not intended that the contents are to be consumed direct from the bottle.

Customers carrying open or sealed bottles or glasses will not be admitted to the premises at any time.

Customers will not be permitted to take open containers of alcohol or soft drinks from the premises.

All bottles and glasses are to be removed from public areas as soon as the contents have been drunk or are empty.

Bottle bins for collection or empty bottles will not be accessible to members of the public

We have a proof of age policy that has been formulated in discussion with the Police and the Licensing Authority.

Drinks Promotions

All-inclusive nights or other irresponsible drinks promotions will not be permitted.

The Designated Premises Supervisor or a Personal Licence holder will be in charge of the premises when any drinks promotions are taking place.

We have an anti-drugs policy that has been agreed following discussion with the Police and the Licensing Authority and is in line with the Safer Clubbing Guidance.

A secure facility to store controlled drugs prior to collection is available.

A drugs register will be maintained.

The Police will be notified of all seizures of controlled drugs.

Crime prevention notices are displayed warning customers of the possibility of crime which may target them, e.g. "Bags should not be left unattended", "Watch out for Pickpockets".

A detailed "Customer Code of Conduct" poster is conspicuously displayed warning customers that if they act in an inappropriate manner they could be barred from all licensed premises in the vicinity.

Any restrictions on the admission of children to the premises are conspicuously displayed outside the premises

A Personal Licence holder will be at the premises at all times when alcohol is being sold or regulated entertainment is being

provided.

We have a policy on the safe management of large groups, i.e. hen and stag parties.

A secure area for customer's personal belongings is available.

We provide food that is available at all times when the premises are open

c) Public safety

We have conducted a suitable Fire Risk Assessment at the premises and implemented the necessary control measures.

All exit doors are easily operable without the use of a key, card, code or similar means.

Exit doors are regularly checked to ensure they function satisfactorily.

Records of all these checks are kept and can be produced on request.

All removable security fastenings are removed whenever the premises are open to the public or staff.

All fire doors are maintained unobstructed and effectively selfclosing and will not be held open other than with approved devices.

Fire resistant doors to service shafts, ducts and cupboards are kept locked shut.

Step and stair edges are appropriately highlighted so as to be conspicuous.

Hangings, curtains and temporary decorations are maintained in a flame retardant condition.

Upholstered seating is fire retardant and complies with current fire safety regulations.

Curtains, hangings and temporary decorations are located so as not to obstruct exits, fire safety signs or fire-fighting equipment.

Notices detailing the actions to be taken in the event of fire or other emergency are prominently displayed and maintained in good condition.

Access is provided for emergency vehicles and kept clear and free from obstruction at all times

. The premises have current certificates of inspection for all portable fire fighting equipment. An inspection is carried out every 6 Months and new certificates will be obtained at these intervals.

- Reasonable evidence that a person who is not a national of a European Economic Area state or Switzerland but who is a family member of such a national or who has derivative rights of residence in exercising treaty rights in the UK including:-
 - evidence of the applicant's own identity – such as a passport,
 - evidence of their relationship with the European Economic Area family member – e.g. a marriage certificate, civil partnership certificate or birth certificate, and

- Dance: no licence is required for performances between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 500. However, a performance which amounts to adult entertainment remains licensable.
- Cross activity exemptions: no licence is required between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, with no limit on audience size for:
 - o any entertainment taking place on the premises of the local authority where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the local authority;
 - o any entertainment taking place on the hospital premises of the health care provider where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the health care provider;
 - o any entertainment taking place on the premises of the school where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the school proprietor; and

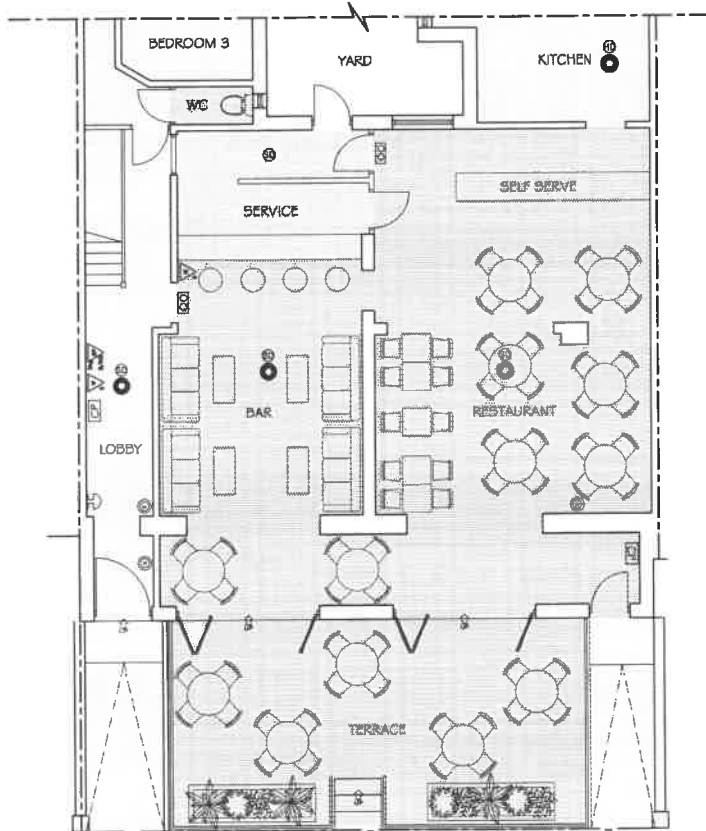

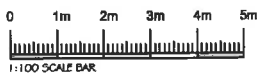

9. All children must leave the bar area by 23:00 hours.
10. CCTV will be installed internally at the premises and will comply with the following:
 - a) The CCTV system shall be installed, maintained and operated to the reasonable satisfaction of Lancashire Constabulary. The entrance and bar areas are to be covered by the system. The system will incorporate a camera covering each of the entrance doors and will be capable of providing an image which is regarded as identification standard.
 - b) The system will display on any recording the correct time and date of the recording.
 - c) Digital recording shall be held for a minimum of 28 days respectively, after the recording is made and will be made available to the Police or any authorised persons acting for Responsible Authority for inspection upon request.
11. All windows and doors will be closed at or before 23:00 hrs.
12. Residents and bona fide guests of Barrons Hotel and the Tamarind Hotel 56 Hornby Road, Blackpool, may be served alcohol for consumption on the premises 24 hours a day. For the avoidance of doubt, residents of 56 Hornby Road are not permitted to remove alcohol from 58-60 Hornby Road, even to take it back to their own hotel room.
